Making an appropriation to the Department of Environmental Resources for erosion control at Presque Isle State Park.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Environmental Resources for erosion control at Presque Isle State Park.

Section 2. So much of the appropriation unexpended or unencumbered on June 30, 1974, shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 1010

Making an appropriation to the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of ninety-five thousand dollars (\$95,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974, for net costs of instruction in the School of Law only.

Section 2. Payments to the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania on account of the appropriation for the items provided in section 1 of this act shall be on the basis of net costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. The Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "College and University Business Administration" of the American Council of Education, revised edition, 1968, without exception.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1973.

AN ACT

SB 908

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the general maintenance and operation of the University of Pennsylvania Museum.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974 for the general maintenance of the University of Pennsylvania Museum and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the University of Pennsylvania Museum.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1973.

No. 4-A

A SUPPLEMENT

SB 920

To the act of July 12, 1973 (P.L. 489, No. 11-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1973," itemizing appropriations required from the Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the proper operations of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund moneys.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This supplement shall be known and may be cited as the "Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund Supplement to the General Appropriation Act of 1973."

Section 2. The following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to finance programs in the several hereinafter named agencies:

I. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

To the Governor

For the Office of the Budget to provide for the cost of publishing reports to the Secretary of the Treasury as required by the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972	\$ 10,000

This appropriation shall be used for continuation during the 1973-1974 fiscal year of all day care programs which have been in operation with State support during the 1972-1973 fiscal year, including continuation of State support to meet the entire local matching requirement for day care service programs for the mentally retarded.

For payment of grants to political subdivisions and approved organizations to provide services for the aging, including but not limited to homemaking services, community care services, foster care services, protective care services and counseling services..... 1,800,000

To the Department of Transportation

II. JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT

Community Courts - District Justices of the Peace

For the payment to the counties in reimbursement of the direct costs incurred by such counties in the administration and operation of all courts established pursuant to Article V, section 1 of the Pennsylvania Constitution. Costs incurred by the counties in the administration and operation of all courts means costs as reported to the Department of Community Affairs in the county's annual financial report forms under the heading (a) "judicial," but confined to subheadings: (125) orphans' court, (126) courts - all other, and (127) justices and aldermen, excluding under all subheadings: capital outlay. If a city coterminous with a county does not report on the Department of Community Affairs' form, its figures from the same subheadings, set forth in the department forms, shall be used: Provided, That such payments shall be made to the county treasurer and in cities of the first class coterminous with counties of the first class to the city treasurer: And, provided further, That in the event the amount herein appropriated is not sufficient to reimburse all such costs, payments shall be made to the counties in the proportion which the costs of each county bears to the total costs of all counties during the most recently completed fiscal year.... 17,000,000

Section 3. All Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund moneys expended by the several State agencies named herein, or by any political subdivision, organization or other agency receiving such moneys from the State agencies named herein shall be spent only in accordance with rules and regulations regarding the expenditure of funds made available under PL 92-512 entitled "State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972."

Section 4. Any part of the appropriations listed above which is unexpended, uncommitted, or unencumbered as of June 30, 1974 shall automatically lapse into the Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund as of that date.

Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

Reimbursement to school districts on account of health services 13,417,000

I withhold my approval from this item because this program should remain a Commonwealth General Fund program thereby earning matching Federal funds. If I were to approve this appropriation from the Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund the Commonwealth would lose \$2,600,000 in Federal matching funds for the Maternal and Child Health program. It is for this reason that I have withheld my approval and I urge the General Assembly to reappropriate funds from the General Fund for this program.

AN ACT

SB 1058

Amending the act of July 12, 1973 (No. 11-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1973," changing, adding and deleting appropriations.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. So much of section 2 as applies to certain items in appropriations to the Governor, the Office of the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor General, and to general fund administrative boards and commissions, the Department of Auditor General, the Treasury Department, the Department of Banking, the Department of Commerce, the Department of Community Affairs, the Department of Education, the Department of Environmental Resources, the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, the Department of Justice, the Department of Health, the Department of Military Affairs, the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, the Department of Public Welfare, the Department of Revenue, the Department of State, and the Department of Transportation and certain items in appropriations to the Senate, House of Representatives and the Legislative Reference Bureau in the Legislative Department, and certain items in appropriations to the Judicial Department, act of July 12, 1973 (No. 11-A), known as "The General Appropriation Act of 1973," are amended or added to read:

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1973, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1973.
