HB 1953

Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled, as amended, "An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for examination and registration of those who desire to engage in the occupation of beauty culture; defining beauty culture, and regulating beauty culture shops, schools, students, apprentices, teachers, managers and operators; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs in the Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," further providing for the management of a beauty shop by an operator-owner and providing for temporary certificates of registration.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), referred to as the Beauty Culture Law, is amended by adding sections to read:

Section 4.4. Management of Beauty Shops.—An owner of a beauty shop, licensed as an operator, may manage his own shop if he operates therein exclusively; otherwise, he shall employ a licensed manager.

Section 12.1. Temporary Certificates of Registration.—(a) The department shall issue a temporary certificate of registration to practice as operator, manager, or teacher as the case may be to those successfully passing the required examinations and after completing the other requirements imposed by this act.

(b) The temporary certificate of registration shall be issued by the inspector to the applicant upon the satisfactory completion of his inspection.

(c) The temporary certificate of registration shall be effective until the applicant receives the permanent certificate of registration from the department. The temporary certificate of registration shall have the same effect as the certificate of registration provided for in section 12.

(d) Notification to a student stating he passed the examination is sufficient to comply with this section.

Section 2. All acts or parts of acts and the regulations thereunder are repealed in so far as they are inconsistent herewith.

Section 3. Section 4.4 of this act shall take effect immediately and shall be retroactive to September 15, 1975, and section 12.1 shall take effect in 60 days.
