HB 880

Amending the act of November 26, 1976 (P.L.1464, No.55-A), entitled "An act to further provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977; to make additional appropriations from the Federal augmentation to the Executive Department for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977, and to appropriate the Federal funds available for implementation of Title II, Public Law 94-369, to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department," changing and adding appropriations and making editorial changes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Parts I, III, IV and VI of section 2, act of November 26, 1976 (P.L.1464, No.55-A), known as the "Supplemental Appropriation Act of 1976," are amended by changing, adding and correcting items to read:

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1976 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1976.

HB 881

Amending the act of July 1, 1976 (P.L.1383, No.17-A), entitled "An act appropriating the Federal augmentation to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977," changing and adding appropriations, reenacting an appropriation for a judicial information system and making editorial changes.

SB 945

Making an appropriation to the State Treasurer for the purpose of paying salaries and wages of State officers and employees and other ordinary and general expenses in the interim between June 30, 1977 and August 1, 1977, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1977.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$160,016,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the purpose of paying the salaries and wages of the officers and employees and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the interim between June 30, 1977 and August 1, 1977, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1977. The funds provided by this act may be used for all preferred appropriations of 1976-1977 but shall not be used for payment of cash grants or medical assistance, or for payment of appropriations to charitable or educational institutions not under the absolute control of the Commonwealth.

Section 2. Payments out of the appropriation of this act shall be made by the State Treasurer upon requisitions by the several departments, boards, commissions or officers in the same manner as payments are ordinarily made.

Section 3. All amounts paid by the State Treasurer in accordance with this act shall be charged against the appropriations made for the salaries and wages of the officers and employees and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts of 1976 and 1977.

Section 4. The funds appropriated in section 1 shall be used solely for providing for the programs in existence during the fiscal year 1976-1977, which programs shall be funded at no more than one-twelfth of the total appropriations contained in Senate Bill No.770, Printer's No.823, Session of 1977, except that funding shall be provided to the Department of Justice for the operation and administration of the Pennsylvania Crime Commission in an amount equal to one-twelfth of the total State and Federal funds appropriated to the Department of Justice for the operation and administration of the Pennsylvania Crime Commission during the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1976.

Section 5. In addition to the amount appropriated by this act, all moneys received from any other source, and from the Federal Government as provided in section 6, as contributions to or payments for the programs

provided herein shall be paid into the General Fund to the appropriation for the purposes and programs intended.

Section 6. The sum of \$40,000,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the expenses of *implementing, continuing* and carrying out the programs, except the Federal funds for cash grants and medical assistance, stated in the Federal Augmentation Appropriation Act of 1976 and the Supplemental Appropriation Act of 1976 and the amendments or supplements to said acts for the interim between June 30, 1977 and August 1, 1977.

Section 7. This act shall take effect immediately.

Making appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare and providing for certain allocations therefrom for the purpose of carrying out the Public Assistance Law for the year beginning July 1, 1977 and for the payment of cash grants and medical assistance and expenses accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on June 30, 1977.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$91,533,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the payment of cash grants and medical assistance and administrative expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1977 and for the payment of cash grants and medical assistance and administrative expenses incurred prior to and remaining unpaid June 30, 1977. In addition to this amount all moneys received from any other source and the Federal Government as provided in section 2 as contributions for this program, shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation. The Department of Public Welfare shall allocate funds from time to time for administrative expenses of the several county boards of assistance, for such administrative expenses incurred by the department which are chargeable to such boards and for the payment of attorney's fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the public assistance and medical assistance programs: Provided, That no rule or regulation shall be adopted by the Secretary of Public Welfare during the fiscal year 1977-1978 which adds to the cost of any public assistance program.

Section 2. The sum of \$74,600,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds for the public assistance and medical assistance programs as stated and allocated in the Federal Augmentation Act of 1976 and the Supplemental Appropriation Act of 1976 and the amendments or supplements to said acts.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1977 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1977.

To the Department of Transportation

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation, including the Transportation Commission and Advisory Committee, and the Statewide coordination of municipal services \$ 21,220,000

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the operation of the highway and safety construction programs, including planning and research, design, engineering, right-of-way acquisition and the operation of the engineering district facilities and liaison services with communities on local road engineering and construction activities 50,000,000

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the administration and operation of the maintenance program for State roads, bridges, tunnels, and structures, including the operation of the county maintenance district facilities. 334,875,000

This item is approved in the sum of \$19,935,000.

I have reduced this item and certain others which follow because the grand total of all the appropriations contained in this bill exceeds the revenues which will be available in the Motor License Fund for the 1977-78 fiscal year. Further, there are several appropriations in this bill which will not be needed, or are in an amount greater than will be needed for the 1977-78 fiscal year.

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the administration and operation of the maintenance program for State roads, bridges, tunnels, and structures, including the operation of the county maintenance district facilities. 334,875,000

This item is approved in the sum of \$264,906,000. I have reduced this appropriation because of insufficient revenues.

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the administration of the traffic safety program and the administration and operation of the operator and vehicle registration programs 37,942,000

This item is approved in the sum of \$37,042,000. I have reduced this appropriation because of insufficient revenues.

To the Treasury Department

For the payment of refunds of liquid fuels taxes for agricultural use to which the Commonwealth is not entitled . 5,500,000

I have approved this item in the sum of \$4,500,000. I have reduced this appropriation because of a revised estimate of needs for the fiscal year.

Refunding liquid fuels tax - political subdivision use. . 1,000,000

I have approved this item in the sum of \$900,000. I have reduced this appropriation because of a revised estimate of needs for the fiscal year.

Refunding liquid fuels tax - volunteer fire companies, volunteer ambulance services and volunteer rescue squads. . 300,000

I have approved this item in the sum of \$100,000. I have reduced this appropriation because of a revised estimate of needs for the fiscal year.

For the payment of interest on tax anticipation notes. . 3,300,000

I withhold my approval from this appropriation. We now do not anticipate the issuance of tax anticipation notes for the 1977-78 fiscal year.

For the payment of legal fees, advertising, cost of engraving and other expenses incurred in the issuance of tax anticipation notes 20,000

I withhold my approval from this item because tax anticipation notes will not be issued during the 1977-78 fiscal year.

In making the above item vetoes, sufficient reductions have been made to result in an unappropriated surplus of \$5.2 million in the Motor License Fund.

I am reserving this balance for an additional appropriation to the State Police which I am requesting the General Assembly to enact immediately.

The sum of \$50,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Governor's Study Commission on Public Employe Relations for the fiscal year 1976-77 for operation and administrative expense. The sum of \$85,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is additionally hereby appropriated to the Governor's Study Commission on Public Employe Relations for the fiscal year 1977-78 for operation and administrative expense.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

APPROVED—This 3rd day of August 1977 except for the following item:

Section 1. The sum of \$50,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Governor's Study Commission on Public Employe Relations for the fiscal year 1976-77 for operation and administrative expense.

I withhold my approval from this appropriation. This appropriation is for a fiscal year which ended, and therefore the funds would automatically lapse since funds were not encumbered for this purpose nor are bills remaining to be paid from the appropriation. Any expenses which may have been incurred by the Study Commission during fiscal 1976-77 have been paid, and therefore this appropriation is not necessary.
