AN ACT

SB 1472

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Welfare for the payment of cash assistance for the fiscal period July 1, 1977 to June 30, 1978.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$23,000,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal period July 1, 1977 to June 30, 1978 for payments of cash assistance.

Section 2. The following sum, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from Federal funds available for fiscal relief to states under section 401 of Public Law 95-216, for the fiscal period July 1, 1977 to June 30, 1978, to the Department of Public Welfare for the following:

To the Department of Public Welfare

For payments of cash assistance . . . . . \$11,240,000

Section 3. The Department of Public Welfare medical assistance regulations published in Volume 8, Number 19 of the Pennsylvania Bulletin shall not be promulgated.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

## AN ACT

HB 1266

Making an appropriation to the Museum of the Philadelphia Civic Center, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for maintenance and the purchase of apparatus, supplies and equipment.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$150,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Museum of the Philadelphia Civic Center, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal period July 1, 1977 to June 30, 1978, for maintenance and the purchase of apparatus, supplies and equipment.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1977.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 2247

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1978 to June 30, 1979, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For educational and general expenses . . . . . \$83,498,000
- (2) For cost of student aid . . . . . 1,760,000
- (3) For cost of agricultural research . . . . . 9,224,000
- (4) For cost of agricultural extension services . . . . . 6,853,000
- (5) For cost of research . . . . . 7,750,000
- (6) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . . . . 2,896,000

Section 2. Payments to Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time students enrollment at a rate not to exceed \$7,465 per student. As a condition of receiving its appropriation, on or after January 1, 1979, the university medical school shall, when accepting first-year students for the next term, set aside 10% of the total number of admissions for students who agree that upon the completion of their medical training, they shall engage in the practice of medicine for a period of four years in an area termed medically deprived by the Pennsylvania Department of Health.

Section 3. If necessary, the Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1978 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.

Section 6. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the Pennsylvania State University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in sections 2 and 3, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures and number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. Each such report, to be submitted prior to October 1, 1979, shall cover the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1978 and shall include for each term during the period:

(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full-time, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) A distribution of faculty members employed part-time by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of students receiving individual instruction at each level of instruction.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) Two classifications: one, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian, and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and two, a classification of faculty members and other professional employees by school and department to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each subdivision in each classification:

(i) The number.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

- (v) Total salary paid.
  - (vi) Total salary paid from college or university funds.
  - (vii) Total salary paid from Federal funds.
  - (viii) Total salary paid from other funds.
- (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full-time identified by school, department and title, an analysis of the average hours per week spent in college or university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 8. In addition to the above requirements relative to this appropriation, each report covering the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1978, shall include for all programs of the university:

- (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.
- (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1976, 1977, 1978 and estimated 1979.

The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with "Higher Education Finance Manual" (1975).

Section 9. The university shall upon admitting a first-year class to the Doctor of Medicine program, admit as many students in that class as can be accommodated by the facilities of the university.

Section 10. The university shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 11. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual" United States Departments of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State-Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1978-1979." Credits granted for non-traditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

Section 12. In addition to the requirements of section 7, the Pennsylvania State University shall, by March 1, 1979, submit to the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives a breakdown of the funds budgeted for this fiscal year for the main campus and each branch campus including expenditures budgeted from this act and expenditures budgeted from moneys other than those appropriated by this act.

Section 13. This act shall take effect immediately.

To the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.843, No.355), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Temple University," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriation and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 1978 to June 30, 1979, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses . . . . .	\$59,836,000
(2) For cost of student aid . . . . .	3,018,000
(3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . . . .	5,412,000
(4) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry . . . . .	600,000
(5) Temple University Hospital . . . . .	2,500,000

Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1, except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine, shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine only shall be made on the basis of full-time students enrolled at the rate of \$7,465 per student. As a condition of receiving its appropriation, on or after January 1, 1979, the university medical school shall, when accepting first year students for the next term, set aside 10% of the total number of admissions for students who agree that upon the completion of their medical training, they shall engage in the practice of medicine for a period of four years in an area termed medically deprived by the Pennsylvania Department of Health.

Section 3. If necessary, Temple University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1978 to June 30, 1979, for the purpose and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses . . . . .	\$55,500,000
(2) For cost of student aid . . . . .	2,960,000
(3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . . . .	4,083,000
(4) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry . . . . .	600,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time student enrollment at a rate not to exceed \$7,465 per student. As a condition of receiving its appropriation, on or after January 1, 1979, the university medical school shall, when accepting first year students for the next term, set aside 10% of the total number of admissions for students who agree that upon the completion of their medical training, they shall engage in the practice of medicine for a period of four years in an area termed medically deprived by the Pennsylvania Department of Health.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1976, 1977, 1978 and estimated 1979.

The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with "Higher Education Finance Manual" (1975).

Section 8. The university shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 9. The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual" United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State-Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1978-1979." Credits granted for non-traditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

Section 10. In addition to the requirements of section 6, the University of Pittsburgh shall, by March 1, 1979, submit to the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives a breakdown of the funds budgeted for this fiscal year for the main campus and each branch campus including expenditures budgeted from this act and expenditures budgeted from moneys other than those appropriated by this act.

Section 11. This act shall take effect immediately.

## A SUPPLEMENT

## HB 2250

To the act of July 7, 1972 (P.L.743, No.176), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of Lincoln University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related institution in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Lincoln University," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriation, and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the College of Lincoln University, Chester County, for the fiscal period July 1, 1978 to June 30, 1979, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

Section 2. Payments to Lincoln University on account of the appropriations for the items provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal period.

Section 3. Payments to Lincoln University of the appropriation herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal period.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2, on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Lincoln University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 4. Lincoln University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal period to which this act relates, Lincoln University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made



from moneys appropriated by this act and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal period. Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of costs and make certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 5. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. Each such report, to be submitted prior to October 1, 1979, shall cover the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1978 and shall include for each term during the period:

(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full-time, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) A distribution of faculty members employed part-time by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of students receiving individual instruction at each level of instruction.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) Two classifications: one, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian, and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and two, a classification of faculty members and other professional employees by school and department to be subdivided by type

of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each subdivision in each classification:

- (i) The number.
  - (ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.
  - (iii) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.
  - (iv) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.
  - (v) Total salary paid.
  - (vi) Total salary paid from college or university funds.
  - (vii) Total salary paid from Federal funds.
  - (viii) Total salary paid from other funds.
- (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full-time identified by school, department and title. An analysis of the average hours per week spent in college or university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 6. In addition to the above requirements relative to this appropriation, each report covering the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1978, shall include for all programs of the university:

- (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.
- (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1976, 1977, 1978 and estimated 1979.

The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with "Higher Education Finance Manual" (1975).

Section 7. The university shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 8. The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education

Finance Manual" United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State-Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1978-1979." Credits granted for non-traditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 3. The university shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 4. The University of Pennsylvania shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements as required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual of 1975," without exception.

Section 10. (a) Any Federal money which has been previously appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated by the Federal Government but remains unspent from prior fiscal years, and will not be renewed for fiscal year 1978-1979, is hereby appropriated.

(b) With the exception of Federal money received under the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration and Title XX Social and Rehabilitative Services subgrants, subgrants may be made between appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly. The Budget Secretary shall submit a list of subgrants to the Chairman of the House and Senate Appropriations Committee quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made from a restricted receipt without a specific appropriation by the General Assembly.

Section 11. In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of disaster assistance or relief shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the departments, boards, commissions or agencies designated by the Governor.

Section 12. This act shall take effect July 1, 1978 or immediately if enacted after July 1, 1978.

Section 2. In the event that there are insufficient funds in the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account to meet the appropriation made by this act, funds may be borrowed from the General Fund to

alleviate this cash flow problem on the condition that all such borrowed funds are repaid by June 30, 1979.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1978 or immediately whichever occurs last.

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$4,000,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Governor for allocation by the Governor to provide disaster relief and assistance for victims of the Great Flood of July, 1977.

(b) *The appropriation for disaster relief and assistance for victims of the Great Flood of July 1977, made pursuant to the act of August 20, 1977 (P.L.411, No.11A), known as the "General Appropriation Act of 1977," and the allocation of such funds by the act of April 28, 1978 (No.51), entitled "An act providing for grants to persons for property damaged or destroyed by flood, establishing the basis for grants, and making an appropriation," are hereby reappropriated to and may be allocated by the Governor for disaster relief and assistance for victims of the Great Flood of July 1977; and such appropriation is in addition to the funds appropriated in subsection (a).*

Section 2. All funds appropriated *or reappropriated* herein which remain unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, [1978] 1979 shall automatically lapse as of that date.

Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

*Section 2.1. Section 4, act of April 28, 1978 (No.51), entitled "An act providing for grants to persons for property damaged or destroyed by flood, establishing the basis for the grants, and making an appropriation," is repealed.*

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
