## AN ACT

SB 877

To further provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1984, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983; and to further appropriate the Federal Augmentation to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1984 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983.

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The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

PART I  
GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 101. Short title.

This act shall be known and may be cited as the Second Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 1983.

Section 102. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

“Employees.” Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

“Expenses” and “maintenance.” Includes all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, fuel, light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renova-

tion, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth share of social security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

SUBPART A  
GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 201. State appropriations.

The following additional sums set forth in this part, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and Legislative Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1983 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983.

Section 202. Federal augmentation appropriations.

The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this part, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1983 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year.

SUBPART B  
EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

Section 211. Executive Offices.—The following amounts are appropriated to the Executive Offices:

For the Office of Policy and Planning.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for administration:

(1) "EDA - Grants to States for Supplemental and Basic Funding" - To implement measures identified to improve Pennsylvania's manufacturing base by stimulating new and expanding small technology-intensive manufacturing industries.

Federal appropriation..... 56,000

For the Crime Victim's Compensation Board for payment of awards.

State appropriation..... 850,000

For the Commission on Crime and Delinquency.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for administration:

(1) "Plan for Juvenile Justice" - For development and administration of a comprehensive Statewide plan for juvenile justice in accordance with the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974.

(1) "Administrative Costs of Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) Projects" - For the costs of administering and maintaining LWCF projects in the State.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for housing and redevelopment:

(1) "ARC - Innovative Housing Program" - To provide supplemental funding for the purpose of administration, planning for and developing housing under the programs of the Department of Housing and Urban Development and the Farmers Home Administration and to provide loans for the predevelopment expenses of a housing development or grant for the purpose of reducing the mortgage amount to assist low and moderate income families.

Section 214. Department of Education.—The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Education:

(2) "Educationally Disadvantaged Children - Migrants" - To improve coordination of environmental safety and resource conservation education among Migrant Education programs (including a carryover of approximately \$26,000).

(3) "Parent Training Collaborative Consortium" - To establish and implement parent/surrogate parent training instructional and support system model for parents of handicapped children (including a carry-over of approximately \$22,000).

(4) "Rural Kindergarten Identification and Development Screening Project" - To develop a model identification and screening process for preschool children living in underserved rural areas.

For the Thaddeus Stevens State School of Technology.

State appropriation..... 221,000

For payments on account of pupil transportation.

State appropriation..... 25,502,000

For services to nonpublic schools.

State appropriation..... 1,120,000

For student supplies for nonpublic schools.

State appropriation..... 127,000

Section 215. Department of Environmental Resources.—The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Environmental Resources:

For the Office of Resources Management.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for the Office of Resources Management:

(1) "Coastal Zone Management" - For support of the coastal zone management program.

Federal appropriation..... 982,000

(2) "404 Program Assumption Study" - To provide the department with practical experience for operating a State 404 program (dredging and filling operations in wetlands).

Federal appropriation..... 32,000

For the Office of Protection.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for the Office of Protection:

(1) "Surface Mine Control and Reclamation" - For a program to implement the interim regulations of the Federal Surface Mine Control and Reclamation Act.

Federal appropriation..... 6,654,000

(2) "Flue Gas Desulfurization Project" - To support the Solid Waste Management Program.

Federal appropriation..... 20,000

For State forestry operations.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for forestry operations:

(1) "Northeast Regional Biomass Program" - To increase wood and other biomass energy development and use in Pennsylvania.

Section 216. Department of Health.— The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Health:

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for general government operations:

(1) "Cooperative Health Statistics - Manpower, Facilities, Vital Statistics" - To develop and implement a health facilities and manpower system. Review and evaluate existing State-level health statistical system to define the extent to which it is responsive to NCHS requirements and standards and needs of other data users. Plan, organize, test and implement systems modifications (including a carryover of approximately \$100,000).

Federal appropriation..... 327,000

(2) "Indochinese Refugee Program" - To serve the unmet public health needs associated with, and the general health needs of, the refugees (including a carryover of approximately \$68,000).

Federal appropriation..... 146,000

(3) "Migrant Health Centers" - To provide clinic services at medical centers and intensify public health nursing services and sanitary surveys of camps for migrant laborers and their families in the Commonwealth and to provide for health services for migrant children.

Federal appropriation..... 529,000

(4) "Disease Control Immunization Program - Project Grants" - To enlist the aid of practicing physicians, official health agencies and volunteers in an immunization program for all susceptible persons in the community, particularly children under the age of five years (including a carryover of approximately \$130,000).

Federal appropriation..... 365,000

(5) "Arthritis Program" - To provide public education through development of instruction to teach self-help arthritis courses.

Federal appropriation..... 58,000

For the Office of Quality Assurance.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for the administration of the Quality Assurance Program:

(1) "Medicare - Health Services Agency Certification" - Perform surveys and inspections to determine whether hospitals, home health agencies, laboratories, clinics and other providers of health services meet requirements as set forth in section 1861 of the Social Security Act and certifying those that qualify to the Secretary of Health and Human Services.

Federal appropriation..... 1,920,000

For the State Laboratory.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for the operation of the State Laboratory:

(1) "Medicare - Health Services Agency Certification" - Perform surveys and inspections to determine whether hospitals, home health agencies, laboratories, clinics and other providers of health services meet requirements as set forth in section 1861 of the Social Security Act and certifying those that qualify to the Secretary of Health and Human Services (including a carryover of approximately \$16,000).

Federal appropriation..... 129,000

(2) "Cannabis Involvement in Traffic Fatalities" - To obtain information concerning the extent to which cannabis and other controlled substances are involved in fatal vehicular accidents in Pennsylvania.

Federal appropriation..... 160,000

For maternal and child health services.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for maternal and child health:

(1) "Special Supplemental Food Service Program for Women, Infants and Children" - To provide iron and protein-rich food to low-income pregnant women, lactating mothers, and infants and children.

Federal appropriation..... 52,000,000

In addition to the specific amounts appropriated herein, all other moneys received from the Federal Government for the Special Supplemental Food Service Program for Women, Infants and Children are hereby appropriated to such program.

For venereal diseases screening and treatment.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for venereal diseases screening and testing:

(1) "Survey and Follow-Up - Venereal Disease" - For the carrying out of case-finding surveys and serologic follow-up ser-

vices (including a carryover of approximately \$11,000).

Federal appropriation..... 638,000

For tuberculosis screening and treatment.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for tuberculosis screening and treatment:

(1) "Tuberculosis Control Program" - To help strengthen and reinforce tuberculosis control in reducing reported cases by at least 5%.

Section 217. Department of Military Affairs.—The following sums are appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs:

(1) "Communications System" - To upgrade and improve the telephone communication system at the Fort Indiantown Gap Military Complex to provide a level of service which meets current and foreseeable future requirements to include emergency operations.

Federal appropriation..... 276,000

For assistance to veterans who are ill or disabled and without means of support.

State appropriation..... 400,000

Section 218. Department of Public Welfare.—The following sums are appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare:

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for general government operations:

(1) "Medical Assistance Program Administration" - For administrative expenses incurred for general government

operations in support of the provision of medical assistance on behalf of eligible persons.

Federal appropriation..... 12,941,000

(2) "Service System Research on the Chronically Mentally Ill" - To evaluate the impact on the various clients enrolled in the Community Residential Rehabilitation System.

Federal appropriation..... 95,000

For Information Systems.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for the Office of Information Systems:

(1) "Maintenance Assistance" - For administrative expenses incurred by the Office of Information Systems in providing cash and emergency assistance to eligible families.

Federal appropriation..... 7,016,000

(2) "Medical Assistance Information Systems" - For administrative expenses incurred by the Office of Information Systems in providing for medical assistance on behalf of eligible persons.

Federal appropriation..... 11,984,000

(3) "Food Stamp Program" - For expenses incurred by the Office of Information Systems in providing an information system in relation to the food stamp program.

Federal appropriation..... 1,419,000

(4) "Child Support Enforcement" - For administrative expenses incurred by the Office of Information Systems to enforce the support obligations owed by absent parents to their children, locate absent parents, establish paternity and obtain child support.

Federal appropriation..... 422,000

For Statewide operations related to county administration of the public assistance and medical assistance programs.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be nec-

essary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for Statewide operations relating to county administration:

(1) "Maintenance Assistance - Statewide Operations Related to County Administration" - For administrative expenses incurred in the provision of Federal maintenance assistance programs.

Federal appropriation..... 5,448,000

(2) "Medical Assistance - Statewide Operations Related to County Administration" - For administrative expenses incurred in relation to the provision of Federal medical assistance services.

Federal appropriation..... 21,332,000

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for county administration:

(1) "Medical Assistance - County Assistance Offices" - For administrative expenses incurred for county administration in relation to the provision of Federal medical assistance services.

Federal appropriation..... 17,788,000

(2) "Food Stamp Program - County Assistance Offices" - For administrative expenses incurred for county administration in relation to the food stamp program.

Federal appropriation..... 23,265,000

For Program Accountability.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for program accountability:

(1) "Medical Assistance - Program Accountability."

Federal appropriation..... 1,143,000

(2) "Maintenance Assistance - Program Accountability."

Federal appropriation..... 1,536,000

(3) "Child Support Enforcement Program - Program Accountability" - For costs incurred by program accountability in support of the Child Support Enforcement Program. Notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary in the Commonwealth State Plan adopted pursuant to Title 4D of the Social Security Act and the regulations thereunder and notwithstanding any provision contained in any cooperative agreement under the Child Support Enforcement Program entered into by the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare and any designated county child support enforcement agency, any funds available to the designated county child support enforcement agency from prior fiscal years' operations or from reimbursement by the Department of Public Welfare pursuant to the provisions of Title 4D of the Social Security Act may be used by the county child support enforcement agency for any activity which is eligible for reimbursement permitted under applicable Federal regulations.

Federal appropriation..... 29,181,000

(4) "Food Stamp Program - Program Accountability" - For administrative expenses incurred by program accountability in relation to the Food Stamp Program.

Federal appropriation..... 1,269,000

(5) "Study of Courts" - To study the State courts and their administrative branches to assess the impact of organizational arrangements and other administrative factors on the enforcement and collection of court ordered child support payments.

Federal appropriation..... 17,000

For the Pennsylvania Employment Program.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for the Pennsylvania Employment Program:

(1) "Work Incentive Program" - For administrative expenses incurred in relation to the Work Incentive Program.



Federal appropriation..... 12,993,000

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for services for the visually handicapped:

(1) "Rehabilitation Services Project" - To provide funding, on a temporary basis, to assist BVS in establishing a full-time deaf-blind specialist position to provide consistent individualized services to deaf-blind clients.

Federal appropriation..... 40,000

For provision of basic institutional and other programs and facilities and to provide general support services for secure programs and facilities for youth offenders.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for basic institutional and other programs and facilities for youth offenders:

(1) "Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention" - To provide a sex offender program within a secure setting with diagnostic and treatment services for adolescent males committed to the facility as a result of a sexual assault or whose history indicates prior sexual offenses.

For the State mental hospitals and the care of patients of such hospitals.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for State mental hospitals:

(1) "Medical Assistance - State Mental Hospitals" - For the provision of medical assistance services to eligible persons at State mental hospitals.

Federal appropriation..... 74,016,000

(2) "Medicare Services - State Mental Hospitals" - For provision of medical ser-

VICES at State mental hospitals that are reimbursable under Medicare.

Federal appropriation..... 23,121,000

(3) "Library Services - State Mental Hospitals" - To assist in establishing and expanding State institutional library services and library services to the physically handicapped.

Federal appropriation..... 16,000

For State centers for the mentally retarded.

(1) "Medical Library Resources Improvement Grant" - To update research and current publications which would otherwise require the sole use of State funds.

Federal appropriation..... 4,000

For intermediate care facilities/MR.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for medical assistance - intermediate care facilities:

(1) "Medical Assistance - Intermediate Care Facilities - Mentally Retarded" - For the provision of medical assistance services to eligible persons in intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded.

SB 952

To provide supplemental appropriations from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt, for allowable net operating costs for intermediate care facilities and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1984, and for the bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983; and to further appropriate the Federal Augmentation to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1984, for allowable net operating costs for intermediate care facilities and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983.

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Section 503. Effective date.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

### PART I GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 101. Short title.—This act shall be known and may be cited as the 1983-1984 Third Supplemental General Appropriation Act.

social security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

PART V  
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 501. Construction of act.—(a) State funds.—(1) Except for the appropriation in the Department of Public Welfare for Medical Assistance - Capitation Plans, all appropriations contained in Part II from the General Fund shall be in addition to any appropriation received pursuant to the act of July 11, 1983 (P.L.422, No.2A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1983, the act of July 21, 1983 (P.L.603, No.7A), known as the Supplemental General Appropriation Act for Fiscal Year 1983-1984, or the act of February 7, 1984 (P.L.1311, No.1A), known as the Second Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 1983.

(2) The appropriation in the Department of Public Welfare for Medical Assistance - Capitation Plans shall replace the similar appropriation contained in the act of July 21, 1983 (P.L.603, No.7A), known as the Supplemental General Appropriation Act for Fiscal Year 1983-1984.

(b) Federal funds.—All appropriations contained in Parts II, III and IV which are the same or similar to an appropriation under the act of July 11, 1983 (P.L.422, No.2A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1983, the act of July 21, 1983 (P.L.603, No.7A), known as the Supplemental General Appropriation Act for Fiscal Year 1983-1984, or the act of February 7, 1984 (P.L.1311, No.1A), known as the Second Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 1983, shall replace that appropriation.

Section 502. Lapsing of unused funds.—(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), that part of all appropriations in Part II unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 1984 shall automatically lapse as of that date.

(b) The appropriation in Part II in the Department of Education to the State System of Higher Education for deferred maintenance shall be a continuing appropriation.

Section 503. Effective date.—(a) This act shall take effect immediately.

(b) That part of section 218 which makes appropriations for long-term care case mix adjustment shall be retroactive to January 1, 1984.

Under provisions of the Pennsylvania Constitution, operating budget appropriations made by the General Assembly may not exceed the actual and estimated revenues and surplus available in the same fiscal year. The appropriations in this bill exceed that limit. Therefore under provisions of the Constitution and The Administrative Code of 1929, I am required to reduce the appropriations in this bill by the amount that they exceed the current unappropriated balance in the General Fund.

While I am prohibited constitutionally from approving this item, I want to reemphasize this Administration's continuing commitment to helping to provide long-term nursing home care. For example, over the past five years, Medicaid funding for nursing homes has increased by 59% or more than \$200 million, to an all time high of more than half a billion dollars this year.

And in public nursing homes, the State has, in recent years, assumed 90% of costs not reimbursed by the Federal Government. This has permitted the counties' share of these costs to drop from 44% in 1976 to 4% in 1981, freeing up substantial funds for use by county governments in meeting their other needs.

Individual ceilings for allowable net operating per diem costs established for the various intermediate care facilities for the fiscal year 1983-1984 shall be increased at a minimum by 6%. The medical assistance net operating reimbursement ceilings for the State fiscal year 1983-1984 shall be computed using the same methodology used for the 1982-1983 ceilings, including the continuation of adjustments made to the alignment of Sandard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA) groupings. The nursing staff allowance recognized for medical assistance reimbursement shall be three nursing hours for intermediate care. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the increase is necessary to maintain appropriate care for patients whose services have been redefined by the department's regulations of January 8, 1983, pertaining to levels of care.

- (1) "Medical Assistance - Long-Term Care Facilities" - For provision of services to patients in long-term care facilities.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Labor and Industry from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to provide for the expenses of administering The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$11,206,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act, and the act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known as The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.
