SB 267

Making additional appropriations of Federal and State funds to the Department of Community Affairs and the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year 1984-1985.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$1,320,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Federal Low-Income Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIEABG) to the Department of Community Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, as a supplemental Federal appropriation for the purpose of low-income residential energy conservation. The moneys shall be spent for comprehensive, cost-effective permanent weatherization improvements consisting of attic insulation/ventilation, including minor repairs not exceeding \$150 per home necessary to complete such insulation; infiltration control measures, including caulking, weather stripping, storm windows and doors; natural gas, oil and coal furnace retrofit; and computerized energy audits to be done by the department.

(b) The sum of \$110,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Federal augmentation amounts to the Department of Community Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for housing and redevelopment for the "DOE" Weatherization Program for supplies and personnel to be used in a program of home weatherization for low-income households.

Section 2. (a) The sum of \$11,000,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, for provision of low-income home energy assistance cash benefits payments.

(b) The appropriation in subsection (a) shall be disbursed, to the extent possible, in the same manner and in accordance with the provisions of the LIHEAP Plan of the Department of Public Welfare for fiscal year 1984-1985 to the following households not exceeding the following income levels:

Under no circumstances shall any household having income in excess of \$18,000 be eligible for assistance under this section.

(c) It is the intent of the General Assembly that this State appropriation be held in reserve and utilized only after the total amount of funds available for cash benefit payments under the Federal Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program have been expended, encumbered or committed as certified by the Secretary of the Budget of the Commonwealth. Such certification shall be made so as to ensure that transition from the use of Federal funds does not result in the interruption of eligibility determination.

(d) The department shall accept applications to determine eligibility for cash benefit payments from this appropriation. No applications for cash benefit payments shall be accepted after April 5, 1985, or 45 days from the effective date of this act, whichever is later.

Section 3. (a) The sum of \$3,000,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Federal Low-Income Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIEABG) to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, as a supplemental Federal appropriation for additional applications for the purpose of lessening the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals.

(b) The sum of \$16,655,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Federal Low-Income Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIEABG) to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, as a supplemental Federal appropriation for the purpose of lessening the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals.

Section 4. The sum of \$1,000,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Federal Oil Overcharge Settlements (OOS) to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, as a supplemental appropriation for the purpose of lessening the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals.

Section 5. (a) The sum of \$4,400,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, as a supplement to Public Assistance Transportation Block Grant (PATBG).

(b) The sum of \$2,700,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, of the Federal Medical Assistance Funds is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, as a supplemental Federal appropriation to provide transportation to eligible public assistance recipients to commute to appointed locations to receive required medical treatment.

Section 6. The sums appropriated in sections 1, 3 and 5 are in addition to the amount appropriated in Part II of the act of June 29, 1984 (P.L.1360, No.7A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1984.

Section 7. This act shall take effect immediately.

APPROVED—The 15th day of February, A. D. 1985, except as to the following:

“Section 2. (a) The sum of \$11,000,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for fiscal year July 1, 1984; to June 30, 1985, for provision of low-income home energy assistance cash benefits payments.

(b) The appropriation in subsection (a) shall be disbursed, to the extent possible, in the same manner and in accordance with the provisions of the LIHEAP Plan of the Department of Public Welfare for fiscal year 1984-1985 to the following households not exceeding the following income levels:

HB 108

Making an appropriation from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the *Office of Consumer Advocate*.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$2,322,000 is specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the *Office of Consumer Advocate* to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1985, or immediately, whichever is later.

HB 109

Making appropriations from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to provide for the operation of the commission for the fiscal year July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986, for the purposes and in the amounts shown:

(1) For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper operation and administration of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.		
State appropriation.....		\$24,290,000
(i) The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated to supplement the sum authorized to be billed to utilities for the operation of the commission:		
(A) "Natural Gas Pipeline Safety" - To enforce the regulations of the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act.		
Federal appropriation.....	140,000	
(B) "Railroad Safety" - For safety inspectors to survey and patrol over 14,000 miles of trackage to eliminate derailment and provide safe rail travel.		
Federal appropriation.....	149,000	

Any Federal funds which the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission receives pursuant to these appropriations shall not be credited to any utility nor used to lower the annual assessment of any utility.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1985, or immediately, whichever is later.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

PART I GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 101. Short title.—This act shall be known and may be cited as the Second Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 1984.

Section 102. Definitions.—The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

“Employees.” Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

“Expenses” and “maintenance.” Includes all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth share of social security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services

incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

Section 104. State appropriations.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, public advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984.

Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.—The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year.

Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.—The following sums as set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the program stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984.

Section 107. Jobs Stimulus Bill appropriations.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from funds available from the Jobs Stimulus Bill to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984.

Section 108. Block grants.—(a) Appropriation.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984.

(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.—The Small Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small cities and com-

munities that have a high concentration of impoverished citizens and sub-standard housing to expand their low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet community development needs.

(c) **Community Services Block Grant.**—The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old and new.

(d) **Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.**—The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG) will be used for the administration and provision of education programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(e) **Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.**—The Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is for the provision of preventive health and other health services related to emergency medical comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and rodent control.

(f) **Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.**—The Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of preventable disease and handicapping condition among children, to provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled individuals under the age of 16 receiving supplemental security income benefits and to provide medical services for children with crippling conditions.

(g) **Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant.**—The Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant (ADAMHSBG) will be used for the administration and provision of drug and alcohol abuse services and community mental health services in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(h) **Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.**—The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income households.

(i) **Social Services Block Grant.**—The Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible persons.

Section 109. Oil Overcharge Settlement appropriations.—(a) **Source of funds.**—In accordance with settlements of litigation brought by the United States Department of Energy against oil companies and refineries for alleged violations of the Federal petroleum price allocation regulations, \$1,000,000 in carryover funds is available to the Commonwealth for specific energy conservation programs through the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985.

(b) **Appropriations.**—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the restricted receipt account, Oil Overcharge Settlements (OOS), to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying

out the program stated herein for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985.

RESTRICTED RECEIPT ACCOUNTS

Section 302. Department of Education.—The following restricted receipt accounts may be established for the Department of Education:

- (1) "Emergency Immigrant Education Assistance" - To provide financial assistance for educational services and costs for immigrant children enrolled in elementary and secondary public and nonpublic schools.

PART IV
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 401. Construction of act.—(a) State funds.—Except for the appropriation in the Department of Public Welfare for medical assistance - capitation and the appropriation in the State Employees' Retirement System for pension increases for annuitants, all appropriations contained in Part II from the General Fund shall be in addition to any appropriations received pursuant to the act of June 29, 1984 (P.L.1360, No.7A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1984 and the act of December 20, 1984 (P.L.1549, No.59A), known as the First Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 1984. The appropriation in the Department of Public Welfare for medical assistance - capitation and the appropriation in the State Employees' Retirement System for pension increases for annuitants shall replace the similar appropriations contained in the General Appropriation Act of 1984.

(b) Federal funds.—All appropriations contained in Part II which are the same or similar to an appropriation under the General Appropriation Act of 1984, shall replace that appropriation.

Section 402. Effective date.—This act shall take effect immediately.

For the Scranton State School for the Deaf.

I withhold my approval from this entire item. We have already provided \$2,790,000 to this institution, and this additional amount is not critical to the current operation of the Scranton State School for the Deaf. The school received a 7% increase in this year's appropriation, and over an 8% increase last year. The school recently had a surplus in the salary category of expenditure and is using this money to provide for some discretionary items. Therefore, not providing this additional money to the school does not impair the quality of education provided at the Scranton State School for the Deaf.

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for the Pittsburgh School District:

(1) "Day-Care Services" - To provide day-care services for children.

I withhold my approval from this entire item. We have already provided over \$600,000 to the Pittsburgh School District to provide day care for up to 237 children. The day-care program operated by the Pittsburgh School District is one of the most expensive programs in the State. One reason for this is that all slots in the program are not filled. The school district has agreed to transfer funds to the day-care program to allow it to continue operating for the remainder of this year without these Federal funds. Therefore, withholding these funds will not impair the quality of day care provided by the program.
