HB 440

Making an appropriation to the Department of Agriculture for animal disease eradication programs.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$1,200,000 is hereby appropriated to the Department of Agriculture to help in the eradication of Avian Influenza and Pseudorabies in this Commonwealth. These funds are to be used to pay for indemnification for live birds and poultry products destroyed during depopulation procedures, for manpower, equipment and supplies needed to destroy infected poultry and to clean and disinfect affected premises, and other necessary expenses incurred by the department due to the Avian Influenza outbreak. These funds may also be used for incentive payments made to swine owners who voluntarily slaughter their breeding swine to help eradicate Pseudorabies under guidelines adopted by the Department of Agriculture.

Section 2. The sum appropriated in this act is in addition to any sums appropriated to the Department of Agriculture by the act of June 30, 1985 (P.L.592, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1985.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

HB 1880

To further provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985; and to further provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986, for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys.

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The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

PART I GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 101. Short title.—This act shall be known and may be cited as the First Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 1985.

Section 102. Definitions.—The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

“Employees.” Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

“Expenses” and “maintenance.” Includes all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen’s compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth share of social security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term “expenses” also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

Section 104. State appropriations.—(a) General Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter

named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, public advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985.

(b) Motor License Fund.—The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985.

Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.—The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year.

All sums expended under an appropriation in Part II of the General Appropriation Act of 1985 and the act of April 18, 1985 (P.L.563, No.3A), entitled "An act making appropriations from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission," shall be credited against the sums appropriated for the same or similar purpose in Part II of this act.

(b) *Motor License Fund.*—The appropriations in Part III of this act which are the same or similar to an appropriation in the act of June 30, 1985 (P.L.715, No.6A), known as the *Motor License Fund Appropriation Act of 1985*, shall replace that appropriation.
