HB 676

Amending the act of July 2, 1986 (P.L.1909, No.10A), entitled "An act itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1986, to June 30, 1987, for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys," increasing the appropriation for the operation of State airports.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. As much as relates to the Department of Transportation in section 3 of the act of July 2, 1986 (P.L.1909, No.10A), known as the Motor License Fund Appropriation Act of 1986, is amended in part to read:

Section 3. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the purposes set forth herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986:

To the Department of Transportation

For payment for aviation operations, including the operation and maintenance of State-owned aircraft, payment of general expenses, supplies, printing and equipment; for the development and maintenance of State airports and the maintenance and repair of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, landing field equipment, beacon sites and other navigation facilities; and for the encouragement and development of civil aeronautics.....

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Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

## AN ACT

SB 549

To further provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1986, to June 30, 1987, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986; to provide appropriations from the Lottery Fund to the Executive Department; and to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted receipts accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 1986, to June 30, 1987, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986.

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The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

**PART I  
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

Section 101. Short title.—This act shall be known and may be cited as the First Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 1986.

Section 102. Definitions.—The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

“Employees.” Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

“Expenses” and “maintenance.” Includes all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen’s compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term “expenses” also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions

when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

Section 104. State appropriations.—(a) General Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and Legislative Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986.

(b) Lottery Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Lottery Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986.

Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.—The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year.

Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.—The following sums as set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the program stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986.

Section 107. Block grants.—(a) Appropriation.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986.

(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.—The Small Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small cities and communities that have a high concentration of impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet community development needs.

(c) Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.—The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG) will be used for the administration and provision of education programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(d) Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant.—The Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant (ADAMHSBG) will be used for the administration and provision of drug and alcohol abuse services and community mental health services in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(e) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.—The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals.

(f) Social Services Block Grant.—The Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible persons.

It is the intent of the General Assembly that, on a Statewide basis, the Department of Public Welfare utilize waivers available under Title 19 of the Social Security Act (section 2176 of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981) to provide services to retarded persons in community settings.

(1) "Social Services - Basic Institutional and Other Programs and Facilities for Youth Offenders" - For provision of social services related to basic institutional programs for youth offenders.

For the operation, maintenance and administration of the State medical and surgical hospitals.

State appropriation..... 14,355,000

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sums appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for State medical and surgical hospitals:

(1) "Medical Assistance - State General Hospitals" - For the provision of medical assistance services to eligible persons at State general hospitals.

Federal appropriation..... 6,699,000

For the State mental hospitals and restoration centers and the care of patients of such hospitals and centers.

State appropriation..... 292,691,000

PART IV  
RESTRICTED RECEIPT ACCOUNTS

Section 401. General provisions.—The Secretary of the Budget may create the restricted receipt accounts set forth in this part for the purpose of administering Federal grants only for the purposes herein designated during the fiscal year July 1, 1986, through June 30, 1987.

Section 402. Department of Education.—The following restricted receipt accounts may be established for the Department of Education:

- (1) "Training Personnel for Education of the Handicapped."

PART V  
CONSTRUCTION AND EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 501. Construction.—(a) The appropriations in Parts II and III of this act which are the same or similar to an appropriation in Parts II and III of the act of July 1, 1986 (P.L.1776, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1986, shall replace that appropriation. All sums expended under an appropriation in Parts II or III of the General Appropriation Act of 1986 shall be credited against the sums appropriated for the same or similar purpose in Parts II or III of this act.

(b) The Federal appropriation for TAA Dislocated Workers - JTPA in section 209 of this act shall be a continuing appropriation and shall not lapse until June 30, 1989.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 807(a) of the act of July 1, 1986 (P.L.1776, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1986, the appropriation in section 216 of Part II of the General Appropriation Act of 1986 relating to job training programs for cash assistance recipients and dislocated workers and the appropriations in section 402 of Part IV of the General Appropriation Act of 1986 relating to tax credits-LERTA and reduction of State-match requirements for economically distressed communities shall lapse on June 30, 1988.

Section 502. Effective date.—This act shall take effect immediately.

Making appropriations from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account and from restricted revenue accounts within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in support of the professional licensure boards assigned thereto.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$9,408,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988.

Section 2. (a) The sum of \$1,471,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Medicine, as authorized by section 907(a) of the act of October 15, 1975 (P.L.390, No.111), known as the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988.

(b) The sum of \$268,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, as authorized by section 907(b) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988.

(c) The sum of \$107,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Podiatry, as authorized by section 907(c) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988.

(d) Each appropriation listed in subsections (a), (b) and (c) shall not be treated as an augmentation to the Department of State, general government appropriation or any other appropriation, but shall be treated and accounted for as separate appropriations respectively.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1987, or immediately, whichever is later.
