Designating Route 581 in Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, as the American Ex-Prisoners of War Highway; designating a section of the Bay Front Parkway in Erie County, Pennsylvania, as the Bernard (Benny) J. Dombrowski Memorial Highway; designating a section of Route 26 in Centre County, Pennsylvania, as the Nittany Parkway; designating a bridge in Bethel Township, Lebanon County, as the Senator Clarence F. Manbeck Bridge; designating the Mount Union Bypass in Huntingdon County as the James DiCosimo Bypass; designating a portion of Route 26 in Huntingdon County as the Standing Stone Parkway; designating a portion of State Route 0094 in York and Cumberland counties as the 94th Infantry Division Memorial Highway; and designating a bridge in Chester County as the Ben Weaver Bridge.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. American Ex-Prisoners of War Highway.

- (a) Designation.—Route 581 in Cumberland County, beginning at Interstate 81 and ending at Interstate 83, is hereby designated and shall be known as the American Ex-Prisoners of War Highway.
- (b) Signs.—The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain road signs which shall display the name of American Ex-Prisoners of War Highway at the beginning and the end of the section of the highway designated in subsection (a).
- Section 2. Bernard (Benny) J. Dombrowski Memorial Highway.
- (a) Designation.—The section of the Bay Front Parkway in Erie County from State Street east to Wayne Street south to the intersection of Bird Drive and East Grandview Boulevard is hereby designated and shall be known as the Bernard (Benny) J. Dombrowski Memorial Highway.
- (b) Service in the House of Representatives.—Bernard (Benny) J. Dombrowski was a committed community servant who served with distinction as a State Representative from the First Legislative District from 1970 to 1990. Also, during his tenure in the House of Representatives he was elected to the position of Majority Caucus Administrator.
- (c) Signs.—The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain road signs which shall display the name of Bernard (Benny) J. Dombrowski at the beginning and the end of the section of the highway designated in subsection (a).

Section 3. Nittany Parkway.

(a) Designation of parkway.—The section of Route 26 in Centre County from the Centre County, Huntingdon County border to State College is hereby designated and shall be known as the Nittany Parkway.

- (b) Road signs.—The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain road signs which shall display the name of Nittany Parkway at the beginning and the end of the section of the highway designated in this section.
- Section 4. Senator Clarence F. Manbeck Bridge.
- (a) Bridge designation.—The bridge located on SR 1022, also known as Camp Strauss Road, and that crosses Monroe Creek in Bethel Township, Lebanon County, is hereby designated and shall be known as the Senator Clarence F. Manbeck Bridge.
- (b) Bridge signs.—The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain bridge signs which shall display the name of Senator Clarence F. Manbeck Bridge at both ends of the bridge designated in this section. Section 5. James DiCosimo Bypass.
- (a) Designation.—The Mount Union Bypass in Huntingdon County, beginning at Juniata Avenue in the village of Allenport, Shirley Township, and proceeding north to the intersection of US 22 in Wayne Township, Mifflin County, is hereby designated and shall be known as the James DiCosimo Bypass.
- (b) Signs.—Within 60 days of completion of construction of the highway described in subsection (a), the Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain road signs displaying the designation "James DiCosimo Bypass" at the beginning and end of the highway.
- Section 6. Designation of Standing Stone Parkway.
- (a) Designation.—That portion of Route 26 in Huntingdon County from the Borough of Huntingdon to the Centre County line is hereby designated and shall be known as the Standing Stone Parkway.
- (b) Signs.—Within 60 days of completion of construction of the highway described in subsection (a), the Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain road signs displaying the designation "Standing Stone Parkway" at the beginning and end of the highway.
- Section 7. Designation of certain highway.
- (a) Designation.—The portion of State Route 0094 from the Pennsylvania line to its terminus in Cumberland County is designated and shall be known as the 94th Infantry Division Memorial Highway.
- (b) Signs.—The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs identifying the above portion of road as the 94th Infantry Division Memorial Highway.
- Section 8. Ben Weaver Bridge.
- (a) Designation.—The bridge over Amtrak/Conrail lines which carries Lincoln Highway, State Route 3070, in Valley Township just west of the Coatesville city line, Chester County, is hereby designated and shall be known as the Ben Weaver Bridge.
- (b) Signs.—The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain signs which shall display the name of Ben Weaver Bridge at each end of the bridge so designated in subsection (a).

Section 9. Effective date.

This act shall take effect as follows:

- (1) Section 1 shall take effect in 60 days.
- (2) Section 2 shall take effect 60 days after the project completion date, notice of which shall be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
 - (3) The remainder of this act shall take effect immediately.
