Making an appropriation from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the State Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$19,638,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to the State Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the State Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000, or immediately, whichever is later.

Making an appropriation from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$30,512,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000, or immediately, whichever is later.

Section 1. The sum of \$4,273,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Consumer Advocate in the Office of Attorney General to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001.

The sum of \$1,015,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Community and Economic Development to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1364

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of Drexel University, Philadelphia.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$6,959,000 is hereby appropriated to the Trustees of Drexel University, Philadelphia, for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for instruction and student aid.

Section 2. Payments to Drexel University on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made quarterly by the Secretary of Education on the basis of costs during the fiscal year and shall be conditioned on continuing authority for inclusion on the Board of Trustees of Drexel University of a minimum of five persons who are not elected officials and who are appointed by the Governor, the President pro tempore of the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives for terms of office coterminous with that of the respective appointing authority.

Section 3. Drexel University shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 4. Drexel University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities."

Section 5. The Trustees of Drexel University shall report on forms provided by the Department of Education to the chairman and the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives by September 30, 2001, on how State-appropriated funds were expended for fiscal year 2000-2001 to reduce the costs to Pennsylvania resident students or to provide services to Pennsylvania residents.

Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1365

Making appropriations to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. (a) The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For dental clinics \$938,000
- (2) For instruction in the Doctor of Medicine program 4,034,000
- (3) For veterinary activities 34,783,000
- (4) For cardiovascular studies 882,000

(b) The sum of \$241,000 is hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for the general maintenance of the University of Pennsylvania Museum and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the University of Pennsylvania Museum.

Section 2. (a) Payments to the University of Pennsylvania on account of the appropriations for the items provided in section 1(a) shall be made quarterly by the Secretary of Education on the basis of costs during the fiscal year and shall be conditioned on continuing authority for inclusion on the Board of Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania of a minimum of four persons who are not elected officials and who are appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives for terms of office coterminous with that of the respective appointing authority and shall be further conditioned on these appointees receiving full voting rights as members of the board of trustees.

(b) The University of Pennsylvania shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

(c) The University of Pennsylvania shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State

System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities.”

(d) The Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania shall report on forms provided by the Department of Education to both the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives by September 30, 2001, on how State-appropriated funds were expended for fiscal year 2000-2001 to reduce the costs to Pennsylvania resident students or to provide services to Pennsylvania residents.

Section 3. (a) Payments to the University of Pennsylvania Museum on account of the appropriation provided in section 1(b) shall be made quarterly by the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission.

(b) The Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1366

Making appropriations to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the MCP Hahnemann University and for continuation of pediatric services.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$8,142,000 is hereby appropriated to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the MCP Hahnemann University for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for instruction in the Doctor of Medicine program.

(b) The sum of \$1,798,000 is hereby appropriated to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the MCP Hahnemann University for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for the general maintenance of the MCP Hahnemann University, including the Allied Health, Professions and Graduate School of the MCP Hahnemann University, and student aid.

(c) The sum of \$321,000 is hereby appropriated to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the MCP Hahnemann University for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for minority educational and recruitment programs.

(d) The sum of \$500,000 is hereby appropriated to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the MCP Hahnemann University for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for cardiovascular studies.

(e) The sum of \$4,000,000 is hereby appropriated to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the MCP Hahnemann University for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for transition expenses.

(f) The sum of \$791,000 is hereby appropriated to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for continued pediatric outpatient and inpatient treatment of severe physically disabling diseases.

(g) The sum of \$166,000 is hereby appropriated to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for continued support of the handicapped children's clinic.

Section 2. (a) Payments to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the MCP Hahnemann University on account of the appropriations provided in section 1(a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) shall be made quarterly by the Secretary of Education on the basis of costs during the fiscal year and shall be conditioned on continuing authority for inclusion on the Board of Trustees of the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation of a minimum of five persons who are not elected officials and who are appointed by the Governor, the President pro tempore of the Senate, the

Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives for terms of office coterminous with that of the respective appointing authority and shall be further conditioned on these appointees receiving full voting rights as members of the board of trustees.

(b) Payments to the Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation on account of the appropriations provided in section 1(f) and (g) shall be made by the Secretary of Health in equal quarterly payments.

Section 3. (a) The Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation for the MCP Hahnemann University shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

(b) The Philadelphia Health and Education Corporation shall provide full, complete and accurate information for the appropriation under section 1(f) and (g) as may be required by the Department of Health or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 4. Section 2. Payments to the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made quarterly by the Secretary of Education on the basis of costs during the fiscal year and shall be conditioned on continuing authority for inclusion on the Board of Trustees of the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine of a minimum of five persons who are not elected officials and who are appointed by the Governor, the President pro tempore of the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives for terms of office coterminous with that of the respective appointing authority and shall be further conditioned on these appointees receiving full voting rights as members of the board of trustees.

Section 3. Making an appropriation to The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia for comprehensive patient care and general maintenance and operation of the hospital.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$500,000 is hereby appropriated to The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for comprehensive patient care for children from birth through age 19 and for general maintenance and operation of the hospital. Payment of this appropriation shall be made by the Secretary of Health in equal quarterly payments.

Section 2. The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Health or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1383

Making an appropriation to the Beacon Lodge Camp.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$124,000 is hereby appropriated to the Beacon Lodge Camp for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for services to the blind.

Section 2. Payments to the Beacon Lodge Camp on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made by the Secretary of Labor and Industry in equal quarterly payments.

Section 3. The Beacon Lodge Camp shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Labor and Industry or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1391

Making an appropriation to the Arsenal Family and Children's Center.

Section 2. Payments to the Arsenal Family and Children's Center on account of the appropriation in section 1 shall be made by the Secretary of Public Welfare in equal quarterly payments.

Section 3. The Arsenal Family and Children's Center shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Public Welfare or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000, or immediately, whichever is later.
