## AN ACT

SB 1344

Making an appropriation from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the State Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$27,348,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to the State Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the State Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1345

Making an appropriation from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$42,297,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

## AN ACT

SB 1346

Making appropriations from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account and from restricted revenue accounts within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in support of the professional licensure boards assigned thereto.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$32,318,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, including the State Board of Auctioneer Examiners, for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

Section 2. (a) The sum of \$8,409,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Medicine for the operation of the board for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

(b) The sum of \$1,349,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine for the operation of the board for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

(c) The sum of \$301,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Podiatry for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

(d) The sum of \$485,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Athletic Commission Augmentation Account for the State Athletic Commission, as authorized by 5 Pa.C.S. § 1512 (relating to Athletic Commission Augmentation Account), for the support and operation of the commission for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

(e) Each appropriation listed in subsections (a), (b), (c) and (d) shall not be treated as an augmentation to the Department of State, general government appropriation, or any other appropriation, but shall be treated and accounted for as separate appropriations respectively.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1347

Making appropriations from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry and the Department of Community and Economic Development to provide for the expenses of administering the Workers' Compensation Act, The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act and the Office of Small Business Advocate for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$76,366,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, and the act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known as The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008.

Section 2. The sum of \$183,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Community and Economic Development as provided in the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$5,205,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Consumer Advocate in the Office of Attorney General to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

Making an appropriation from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Community and Economic Development.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$1,020,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Community and Economic Development to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 2313

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; and providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations, for a method of accounting for the funds appropriated and for certain fiscal information disclosure.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For education and general expenses . . . . .	\$267,451,000
(2) For the cost of agricultural research . . . . .	25,594,000
(3) For the cost of agricultural extension services . . . . .	30,384,000
(4) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students . . . . .	454,000
(5) For the Pennsylvania College of Technology . . . . .	13,103,000
(6) For debt service related to the former Williamsport Area Community College . . . . .	1,389,000

Section 2. Payments to The Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, The Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds listed in section 1(1) to the appropriation listed in section 1(2), (3), (4), (5) and (6), provided that the aggregate amount transferred out of section 1(1) shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to The Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by The Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of

Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. (a) The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, The Pennsylvania State University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by The Pennsylvania State University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. The Pennsylvania State University shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 7. The Pennsylvania State University shall present and report its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with: the generally accepted accounting principles as prescribed by the National Association of College and University Business Officers, the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants or their successors or by any other recognized authoritative body; the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities"; and the financial reporting policies and standards promulgated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by the Federal Government that apply to the Pennsylvania State University.

Section 8. The Pennsylvania State University shall make all articulation agreements with other higher education institutions available on the Internet.

Section 9. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

HB 2314

Making an appropriation to the Fox Chase Institute for Cancer Research, Philadelphia, for the operation and maintenance of the cancer research program.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$766,000 is hereby appropriated to the Fox Chase Institute for Cancer Research, Philadelphia, for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, for the operation and maintenance of the cancer research program. Payment of this appropriation shall be made by the Secretary of Health in equal quarterly payments.

Section 2. The Fox Chase Institute for Cancer Research shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Health or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations, for a method of accounting for the funds appropriated and for certain fiscal information disclosure.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses . . . . .	\$166,777,000
(2) For student life initiatives . . . . .	435,000
(3) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students . . . . .	442,000
(4) For the teen suicide center at the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic . . . . .	523,000
(5) For rural education outreach . . . . .	2,557,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 4. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such

moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 5. The University of Pittsburgh shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 6. The University of Pittsburgh shall present and report its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with: the generally accepted accounting principles as prescribed by the National Association of College and University Business Officers, the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants or their successors or by any other recognized authoritative body; the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities"; and the financial reporting policies and standards promulgated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by the Federal Government that apply to the University of Pittsburgh.

Section 7. The University of Pittsburgh shall make all articulation agreements with other higher education institutions available on the Internet.

Section 8. No funds appropriated by this act may be used for costs of personnel and operations of the environmental law clinic.

Section 9. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

Making appropriations to the Wistar Institute, Philadelphia, for operation and maintenance expenses and for AIDS research.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$211,000 is hereby appropriated to the Wistar Institute, Philadelphia, for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, for the operation and maintenance of the institute.

(b) The sum of \$91,000 is hereby appropriated to the Wistar Institute-Research, Philadelphia, for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, for research on acquired immune deficiency syndrome.

(c) Payment of the appropriations in this section shall be made by the Secretary of Health in equal quarterly payments.

Section 2. The Wistar Institute shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Health or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

- (1) For education and general expenses . . . . . \$175,062,000
- (2) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students . . . . . 442,000

Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. (a) Payment to Temple University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Temple University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 4. (a) Temple University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Temple University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys

Section 1. The sum of \$14,493,000 or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Trustees of Lincoln University, Chester County, for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, for educational and general expenses.

Section 2. Payments to Lincoln University on account of the appropriation for the items provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. (a) Payments to Lincoln University of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Lincoln University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 4. (a) Lincoln University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Lincoln University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Lincoln University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 5. Lincoln University shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 6. Lincoln University shall present and report its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with: the generally accepted accounting principles as prescribed by the National Association of College and University Business Officers, the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants or their successors or by any other recognized authoritative body; the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities"; and the financial reporting policies and standards promulgated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by the Federal Government that apply to Lincoln University.

Section 7. Lincoln University shall make all articulation agreements with other higher education institutions available on the Internet.

Section 8. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.

State Gaming Fund.—The following amounts set forth in this part, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the State Gaming Fund restricted revenue accounts under 4 Pa.C.S. § 1401 (relating to slot machine licensee deposits) to the agencies of the Executive Department named in this part for the purposes set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008.

Section 302. Attorney General.—The following amounts are appropriated to the Attorney General:

For salaries, wages and all necessary expenses of the Attorney General related to 4 Pa.C.S. Pt. II (relating to gaming).

PART V  
STATE GAMING FUND

Section 501. State Gaming Fund.—The following amounts set forth in this part, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the State Gaming Fund to the agencies of the Executive Department named in this part for the purposes set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008.

Section 502. Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board.—The following amounts are appropriated to the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board.

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper operation and administration of the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board. This appropriation includes \$11,126,000 from the restricted revenue account established in the State Gaming Fund for fees and other revenues collected by the board.

Section 503. Loan.—Unrestricted funds appropriated to the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board under this part in the amount of \$22,184,000 shall constitute a loan and shall be repaid in the manner set forth in section 1720-I of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code. The board shall defer assessing slot machine licensees for repayment until such time as 11 slot machine licenses have been issued and 11 licensed gaming entities have commenced the operation of slot machines.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 701. Transfers prohibited.—There is no authority for the State Treasurer, the Secretary of the Budget, the Secretary of Revenue or the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board to transfer any money within or between the appropriations in Part III or Part V.

Section 702. Effective date.—This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.
