LAW AGAINST POLYGAMY.

Chapter 11. *And be it &c:* That whosoever Shall be Convicted of having two Wives or two husbands att one and the Same time Shall be imprisoned all their Life-time in the house of Correction at hard Labour, to the behoof of the former wife & children or the former husband & children And if a Man or Women being Unmarried do knowingly Marry the husband or wife of another person, hee or shee Shall be punished after the same Manner aforesaid.

Originally chapter 14, confirmed by chapter 63, 1683, and renumbered. Abrogated in 1693, but accepted in Petition of Right, June 1, 1693, as chapter 8.

CHAPTER 12.

---

LAW AGAINST DRUNKENNESS.

Chapter 12. *And be it &c:* That every person disordering and abusing himself with drink unto drunkenness, being Legally convicted thereof Shall for the first time pay 5 shillings or work 5 days in the house of correction at hard Labour & be fed only with bread & Water, And for the second offence & ever after 10 shillings or 10 days' Labour as aforesaid.

Originally chapter 15, confirmed by chapter 63, 1683, and renumbered. Supplemented by chapter 83, 1683. Abrogated in 1693, but accepted in Petition of Right, June 1, 1693, as chapter 9.
