

shall be for not marking all bread made for Sale: And the said officer shall have One third part of all forfeitures for his pains, the rest to the poor, as aforesaid.

And further to prevent fraud, That all persons within this Province & territories thereof who shall usually sell bread within doors or without, shall at all times hereafter, have all their bread that they either put to Sale or Spend in their families made of the due assizes, marked and yealded to tryall of the said officer, as is directed in the Law aforesaid, Under the penalty therein exprest.

CHAPTER 89.

LAW ABOUT BRIDGES.

Chap: 89 And be it &c. That Bridges shall be built over all Smaller Creeks & Rivers (that are difficult or apt to be high by Suddain Rain) in the Kings high-way, from the falls of Delaware to the Southern-most parts of Sussex-County, within the space of 18 Months from the time aforesaid, which bridges shall be 10 foot broad & a Rail on each Side . . . And that all trees Stubbs & Stumps of trees that Lye in, & Cross the said high way, & all passages into & out of Creeks & branches, may be made Safe & easy both for horse & Cart, att the Charge of the respective Counties in manner aforesaid.

And the County-Court in every County shall every 7th month yearly chose & appoint 3 overseers at Least, for the high-ways, upon the penalty of 10 pounds sterling . . . And such overseers shall Summon in all their inhabitants of their respective Limits to Come in & work at the Making & mending of all high-ways & bridges therin Upon the penalty of 5 pounds: And every inhabitant So Summoned as afore-said that shall not appear & do his Labour, shall pay to the use of the publick 20 shillings sterling.
