
 CHAPTER MCCCVII.

AN ACT TO REPEAL PART OF THE ACT, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO REGULATE THE GENERAL ELECTIONS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH AND TO PREVENT FRAUDS THEREIN"¹ AND TO AMEND AND ALTER THE "ACT FOR THE BETTER REGULATION OF JURIES."²

(Section I.-P. L.) Whereas by the thirty-fifth section of the act entitled, "An act to regulate the general elections of this commonwealth and to prevent frauds therein," the sum of eight shillings and four pence per diem is directed to be paid by the county treasurer to the judges, inspectors and clerks respectively while employed in the duties required of them by the said act, which allowance is thought to be altogether an unnecessary expense:

[Section I.] (Section II. P. L.) Be it therefore enacted and it is hereby enacted by the Representatives of the Freemen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met and by the authority of the same, That the said section be and the same hereby is repealed, annulled and made void.

(Section III. P. L.) And whereas the daily allowance made by the sixteenth section of the act, entitled "An act for the better regulation of juries," is though unnecessary:

[Section II.] Be it therefore enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the sixteenth section of the said act be and the same is hereby repealed, annulled and made void.
