

CHAPTER MCCCLX.

A SUPPLEMENT TO AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO DIVIDE WASHINGTON COUNTY INTO ELECTION DISTRICTS."¹

(Section I, P. L.) Whereas the freemen of the fifth district of Washington county have by their petition set forth that they labor under great inconvenience in attending upon their elections, the place of meeting (which is at Joshua Meek's not being central:

For remedy whereof:

[Section I.] (Section II, P. L.) Be it enacted and it is hereby enacted by the Representatives of the Freemen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act the boundary line of the fifth district shall begin at the mouth of Flaherty's run, thence along the county line to the plantation of Joseph Scott, Esquire, on Montour's run, thence to Armstrong's mill on Miller's run, thence with the boundary line described in the act to which this is a supplement. And the freemen of the [said] fifth district shall hold their elections at the house of Elizabeth McCanless.

[Section II.] (Section III, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the said act entitled "An act to divide Washington county into election districts," (2) as far as the same respects the boundary line which divides the fifth and third districts and ordains the place of election for the fifth district to be at the house of Joshua Meeks is hereby repealed and declared null and void.
