funds accruing and growing due to this Commonwealth towards the payment of the expenses of government and to provide a fund for other purposes," passed the twenty-sixth day of March one thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine.

[Section III.] Provided, That the payment of such orders shall not interfere with the appropriation of part of the fund as directed by an act entitled "An act to appropriate the sum of five thousand pounds annually for the purposes therein mentioned."²

CHAPTER MCDLXVII.

AN ACT TO REPEAL SO MUCH OF AN ACT OR ACTS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THIS STATE AS AUTHORIZES AND DIRECTS THE RECEIVING OF CERTIFICATES OF THE UNITED STATES IN PAYMENT OF LANDS PURCHASED OR TO BE PURCHASED OF THIS STATE.

(Section I, P. L.) Whereas by virtue of sundry acts of the general assembly of this state certificates granted by the United States are receivable in payment for lands belonging [to] and sold by this state:

And whereas this state being indebted to its own citizens and others it is reasonable and expedient that the property belonging to it should be applied in satisfaction of such debts and it cannot be douted that the wisdom and justice of the congress of the United States will, from the ample funds now in their power, make a proper provision for the debts due from the United States:

[Section I.] (Section II, P. L.) Be it therefore enacted and it is hereby enacted by the Representatives of the Freemen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and by the authority of the same, That so much of any act or acts of the general assembly of this state as authorizes or di-

rects the receiving of any certificates issued or granted by the United States in payment of any lands purchased or to be purchased of this commonwealth shall be and is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER MCDLXVIII.

AN ACT TO LIMIT THE TIME OF EXHIBITING CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE FOR SUPPLIES FURNISHED OR SERVICES RENDERED DURING THE LATE WAR.

(Section I, P. L.) For the purpose of establishing a due limitation of the time of exhibiting claims against the state for supplies furnished or services rendered during the late war.

[Section I.] (Section II, P. L.) Be it enacted and it is hereby enacted by the Representatives of the Freemen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of January which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-one, no claims or demands not already liquidated and adjusted by the proper officers of this state for articles or suplies of any kind furnished by individuals for the use of this state or for services of any kind rendered to this state during the late war between the United States and the King of Great Britain shall be received or admitted nor shall this state be held or deemed liable to satisfy any such claim not preferred before the said first day of January which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-one.

And in order that sufficient notice may be given to all persons concerned:

[Section II.] (Section III, P. L.) Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the prothonotaries of the respective county courts of common pleas for the several counties of this state shall cause one or more printed copies of this act to be affixed to the door of the respective court houses of such
