CHAPTER MCDLXVIII.

AN ACT TO LIMIT THE TIME OF EXHIBITING CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE FOR SUPPLIES FURNISHED OR SERVICES RENDERED DURING THE LATE WAR.

(Section I, P. L.) For the purpose of establishing a due limitation of the time of exhibiting claims against the state for supplies furnished or services rendered during the late war.

[Section I.] (Section II, P. L.) Be it enacted and it is hereby enacted by the Representatives of the Freemen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of January which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-one, no claims or demands not already liquidated and adjusted by the proper officers of this state for articles or supplies of any kind furnished by individuals for the use of this state or for services of any kind rendered to this state during the late war between the United States and the King of Great Britain shall be received or admitted nor shall this state be held or deemed liable to satisfy any such claim not preferred before the said first day of January which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-one.

And in order that sufficient notice may be given to all persons concerned:

[Section II.] (Section III, P. L.) Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the prothonotaries of the respective county courts of common pleas for the several counties of this state shall cause one or more printed copies of this act to be affixed to the door of the respective court houses of such

counties and shall also cause this act to be publicly read in open court at least once in each term for the four terms next ensuing the enacting hereof.

CHAPTER MCDLXIX.

AN ACT TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF HOLDING THE STATE CONVENTION.

(Section I, P. L.) Whereas it is necessary to determine the allowance to be made to the members of the state convention which is to be held for the purpose of reviewing and if they see occasion altering and amending the constitution of this state and also to provide for the same together with the incidental expenses of the said convention:

[Section I.] (Section II, P. L.) Be it therefore enacted and it is hereby enacted by the Representatives of the Freemen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and by the authority of the same, That the same allowances shall be made of wages and mileage to attending members of the state convention as is now made to the members of the General Assembly and that the same together with the incidental expenses of the convention be paid by warrant or warrants on the state treasurer drawn by the president or chairman of the said convention and countersigned by the comptroller and register general.
