

CHAPTER MMCLXXXVII.

AN ACT TO RE-ANNEX PART OF FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP, IN THE COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND, TO THE FIFTH ELECTION DISTRICT IN SAID COUNTY.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all that part of Franklin township, in the county of Westmoreland, that lies south of the new Frankstown road be, and it is hereby, re-annexed to the fifth election district in said county; and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the courthouse in the borough of Greensburg, anything in any former law or laws to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER MMCLXXXVIII.

AN ACT TO ERECT THE COUNTY OF WARREN, AND PARTS OF CRAWFORD AND VENANGO COUNTIES, INTO SEPARATE ELECTION DISTRICTS.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this act, the county of Warren shall be, and the same is hereby, erected into a separate election district; and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Robert Andrews, in said county, and to be called the first district, any law to the contrary hereof notwithstanding.

[Section II.] (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That such parts of Crawford and Venango counties, as are included within the following bounds, viz: Beginning at the northwest corner of a tract of land surveyed in the name of Andrew Cress; thence north along the line of district No. 7 to the most southerly line of Warren county; thence east along the line of said county of Warren to the Allegheny river; thence down the said river to the northeast corner of a survey in the name of Adam Felt; thence west a direct line to the place of beginning, shall be, and the same is hereby, erected into a separate election district; and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Joel Greene, in said district, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER MMCLXXXIX.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR DEFRAYING THE EXPENSE OF SURVEYING THE ISLANDS IN THE ALLEGHENY AND OHIO RIVERS, AND THE SEVERAL RESERVED TRACTS OF ERIE, WATERFORD, FRANKLIN AND WARREN.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the comptroller and register general be, and they are hereby, authorized and required to settle the accounts of Alexander M'Dowell and Thomas Rees, for sundry services in surveying the islands in the rivers Allegheny and Ohio, and for sundry services in surveying the several reserved tracts of Erie, Waterford, Franklin and Warren, as well as for certain expenses attending the same, and to make such allowance therefor as they may deem reasonable.

[Section II.] (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That upon such settlement and allowance being made, the same shall be certified by the said comptrol-
