Section XXIII. (Section XXIII, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if the legislature should at any time after the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, think proper to take possession of the said road, three persons shall be chosen by the governor of the commonwealth, and three by the president and managers of the said company, and three by the judges of the supreme court, who, or any six or more of them, shall proceed to examine and estimate the value of the property which the said company have therein, and certify the amount thereof to the governor, who shall cause the same to be laid before the legislature at their next session; and whenever the amount so certified shall be paid, the right of the said company to take toll on the said road, together with all their right, title, claim and interest therein, shall cease and determine. (1)

## CHAPTER MMCDXLIII.

AN ACT APPOINTING THE PLACE WHEREUPON TO ERECT THE COURTHOUSE AND PUBLIC OFFICES FOR THE COUNTY OF CRAWFORD.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate, and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of the county of Crawford shall, as soon as convenient, erect the court house and public offices for said county, upon the piece of ground in the town of Meadville, known by the name of the Public Square.
