

CHAPTER MMDCCVIII.

AN ACT TO ERECT THE TOWN OF BELLEFONTE, IN CENTRE COUNTY,
INTO A BOROUGH.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the town of Bellefonte, in Centre county, including the lots and land attached and belonging to the said town, shall be, and the same is hereby erected into a borough, which shall be called "The Borough of Bellefonte," bounded and limited as follows, viz. by lands of John Dunlop and Nathaniel Simpson, on the south and east, by land of James Dunlop, on the north, and by Spring creek, and land of James Harris, on the west; and it shall and may be lawful for the persons residing within the borough of Bellefonte, to exercise and enjoy similar rights and privileges; and at the same times, under similar rules and regulations, shall and may elect and appoint similar borough officers; which said borough officers and inhabitants, shall exercise similar and equal powers and authorities, and be in all things governed by similar rules and regulations as are granted to and provided for the inhabitants and borough officers of the borough of Williamsport, in the county of Lycoming, by an act of assembly, passed in the present session of the legislature, entitled "An act to erect the town of Williamsport, in the county of Lycoming, into a borough."⁽¹⁾
