

amount of the tax to which such tract or tracts of land would have been otherwise liable, and to enforce the collection thereof, in the same manner that taxes due on unseated lands are or may be assessed and collected: Provided, that nothing in this act nor in the act⁽¹⁾ to which this is a supplement, shall be construed as giving greater validity to unexecuted land warrants, than they are now entitled to, nor to the detriment of persons under legal disabilities: Provided, such person or persons comply with the foregoing requisitions within the time or times limited respectively, after such disability shall be removed.

Section II. (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the second section of the act, entitled "An act enjoining certain duties on the holders of land warrants not executed, and on the holders of unseated lands,"⁽¹⁾ be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER MMDCXXII.

A SUPPLEMENT TO AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT FOR RAISING BY WAY OF LOTTERY, THE SUM OF TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR REMOVING THE OBSTRUCTIONS AND IMPROVING THE NAVIGATION OF THE RIVER SUSQUEHANNA, AND CERTAIN BRANCHES THEREOF." (1)

Whereas it has been represented to the legislature by Thomas Boude, Samuel Bethel, Jacob Strickler, William P. Beatty, John Evans and Christian Breneman, six of the managers named in an act of the legislature of this state, bearing date the eighteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and five,⁽¹⁾ for the purpose of raising by way of lottery, twenty thousand dollars, that Adam Reigart, jun., Philip Diffenderfer, and Michael Gundacker, three of the managers named in said act, have declined the duty enjoined on them: And whereas it has also been requested by the said Thomas Boude, Samuel Bethel, Jacob Strickler, William P. Beatty,

John Evans, and Christian Breneman, that the places of the said Adam Reigart, jun., Philip Diffenderfer and Michael Gundacker, may be supplied with other persons, and that an additional number of managers may be appointed, and also that the place of drawing said lottery may be changed from the borough of Lancaster to the town of Columbia, in the county of Lancaster: Therefore,

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Emanuel Reigart, Hugh Wilson, and Michael Rine, be, and they are hereby appointed managers in the room of the said Adam Reigart, jun., Philip Diffenderfer, and Michael Gundacker, and that Abraham Witmer, Christian Stoner, Andrew Kauffman, George Pretzler, Nathaniel Barber, Philip Gosler, and George Snyder, of the county of Lancaster, Thomas Grant, of the town of Northumberland, in the county of Northumberland, James Duncan, of Aaronsburg, in the county of Centre, John Blair and Robert Allison, of the town of Huntingdon, in the county of Huntingdon, and George McClelland, of Lewistown, in the county of Mifflin, be, and they are hereby appointed additional managers, and that the said managers, in conjunction with Thomas Boude, Samuel Bethel, Jacob Strickler, William P. Beatty, John Evans, Christian Breneman, Joseph Poole, William Ferree, and Leonard Eichholtz, nine of the managers named in the act to which this is a supplement, be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to carry the said act into execution, subject to the qualifications and restrictions therein contained; and in case of the death, or resignation of any or either of the said managers, the survivors, or any six of those who continue to act, are hereby authorized and empowered to do and perform all and every matter and thing mentioned and required in the said act.
