same in discharge of the said claims and demands; and that it shall be the duty of the persons appointed in the said borough or townships to settle the accounts of the supervisors of the highways, to settle the accounts of the overseers of the poor of said borough, and their respective townships.

CHAPTER MMDCCLVI.

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF ISAAC ELY.

Whereas it has been represented to the legislature, that Isaac Ely of Reading in the county of Berks, on the eighth day of August, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, enlisted in the company of captain Andrew Redheffer, in colonel John Moore's battalion of the Pennsylvania flying camp; and on the eighteenth day of November, following, was taken prisoner at Fort Lee; continued in confinement to about the middle of February following (the greater part whereof in a prison ship, where he suffered considerably), then permitted to go home on parole for a considerable time; and was exchanged some time in the month of May, one thousand seven hundred and eighty; being three years nine months and some days from the time of his enlistment to the time of exchange, during all which time he received no pay, as testified by his captain: Therefore,

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be and he is hereby authorized and required to draw his warrant on the treasurer in favor of Isaac Ely, for one hundred and three dollars, to be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
