

CHAPTER MMDCLXII.

AN ACT APPOINTING A TRUSTEE IN CENTRE COUNTY.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That John G. Lowry be, and he is hereby appointed a trustee for Centre county, in the room and stead of Robert Boggs, esq., deceased: And the said John G. Lowry is hereby invested with all and singular the powers and authorities, and subjected to all the duties which by law are vested in, and required of a trustee of said county.⁽¹⁾

CHAPTER MMDCLXIII.

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF ANDREW PATTERSON.

Whereas it appears to the legislature that Andrew Patterson of York county, was an enlisted soldier for and during the war, and served as an artificer in a company of artificers commanded by captain Thomas Wiley; but from a wound received in his wrist, after serving about three years, was discharged, and left the service without receiving any of his bounty or clothing: Therefore,

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the officers of the land office, are hereby authorized and required to issue a patent to Andrew Patterson for such quantity of donation land, as he would have been entitled to had he served to the end of the war.
