paid out of the monies arising from the sales of the town and out-lots belonging to the commonwealth, in and adjoining the town of Erie in the county aforesaid.

Section II. (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall be lawful for the commissioners aforesaid, or a majority of them, to contract with any person or persons for improving said creeks or any parts thereof within the limits assigned to them; and to take such surety or sureties for the faithful performance of such contract or contracts as they or a majority of them may think proper.

Section III. (Section III, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall be the duty of the said commissioners to render an account of the monies and expenditures aforesaid, to the auditors for settling the accounts of the commissioners; who are hereby authorized to adjust and settle the same; and to allow the said commissioners one dollar and thirty-three cents for every day they shall be necessarily employed in the performance of the duties required of them by this act, to be paid out of the county treasury.

CHAPTER MMDCCCXXXV.

AN ACT APPROPRIATING A SUM OF MONEY FOR LAYING OUT AND OPENING A STATE ROAD FROM LOGAN'S NARROWS, IN THE COUNTY OF HUNTINGDON, TO THE STATE ROAD LEADING TO PRESQUE ISLE.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of eight hundred dollars, be, and the same is hereby appropriated, for the pur-

pose of laying out, and opening a state road; to begin at Logan's Narrows in the county of Huntingdon, and from thence leading across the west branch of the river Susquehanna, near the mouth of Anderson's creek, in the county of Clearfield, to the state road which leads to Presqué Isle; three hundred dollars of which sum shall be expended upon that part of the road which shall be in the county of Huntingdon; and the remainder upon that part which shall be in the county of Clearfield.

Section II. (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the governor, be, and he is hereby authorized and required to draw his warrant upon the treasury, in favor of the county commissioners of Huntingdon county, for the aforesaid sum of three hundred dollars; and in favor of the county commissioners of Centre county, for the sum of five hundred dollars; and it shall be the duty of the commissioners aforesaid, to render an account of the expenditure of the said sums of money, respectively, to the auditors for settling the accounts of the commissioners of their respective counties; who are hereby authorized to adjust and settle the same; and to allow the said commissioners one dollar and thirty-three cents, for every day they shall be necessarily employed, in the performance of the duties required of them by this act, to be paid by their respective counties.

Section III. (Section III, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the commissioners of the respective counties aforesaid, or a majority of them, be, and they are hereby authorized to contract with individuals for laying out, and opening so much of the aforesaid road, as shall be within the limits of their respective counties; and take such surety or sureties for the faithful performance of such contract, or contracts, as to a majority of them respectively shall appear necessary.
