

CHAPTER MMDCCCLXXIX.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND, TO VACATE THAT PART OF THE STATE ROAD THAT LIES BETWEEN JONES' MILL IN SAID COUNTY, AND THE LINE OF SOMERSET COUNTY.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall be lawful for the court of quarter sessions in the county of Westmoreland, upon application to the said court, being made to grant an order and appoint fit persons to view that part of the state road that lies between Jones's mill and the line of Somerset county, on the Laurel hill, and also to view the new road opened and made by Thomas Jones and William Blackhouse between the places aforesaid, and it shall be the duty of the said viewers to report to the said court which of the two roads or what part of either should in their opinion be vacated, and on confirmation by the court of said report, the other road shall be deemed and considered a state public highway, and shall be kept in repair as other roads are now kept in repair by the proper county or township.
