

son now resides, one hundred and fifty-four perches to a birch tree the southeast corner of the said tract, thence by the same westwardly to an ironwood tree, the southeast corner of a tract of land on which Alexander Caldwell now resides, and thence on the same direction from the southeast corner of one tract to the southeast corner of the next, to the western boundary of the state, anything in any other law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER MMMIX.

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE NORTHUMBERLAND ACADEMY.

Whereas it has been represented by the trustees of Northumberland academy, that in consequence of a conditional grant of three thousand dollars as well as an absolute grant of two thousand dollars to be paid out of the arrearages of state taxes by the commissioners of Northumberland county, that they have proceeded to finish one half of their building by borrowing money to enable them so to do, but that contrary to their expectation, they have only received four hundred and thirty dollars thereof, and have no hopes of receiving the remainder; that they have never received any part of the conditional grant of three thousand dollars, owing to the impossibility of complying with the conditions thereto annexed; that in consequence thereof they have become involved in such embarrassing circumstances, out of which they despair of ever being able to extricate themselves, have prayed the legislature to grant them relief in the premises: Therefore,

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the treasurer of Northum-

berland county shall pay out of the arrears of loan office money, which may come into his hands, the sum of two thousand dollars, to the trustees of Northumberland academy for the use thereof, for which sum the said treasurer shall have credit from time to time in the settlement of his accounts, with the accountant officers, on producing the receipt of the said trustees on their treasurer: Provided, that the said trustees do release under their hands and seals, all right, title, claim and demand which they either now have or hereafter may have, to three thousand dollars conditionally granted to them for the use of said academy, by an act of the general assembly, passed January twentieth, one thousand eight hundred and four,⁽¹⁾ and that the said trustees do also release under their hands and seals, all right and title which they have to demand and receive from the treasurer of Northumberland county, any further arrearages of state taxes under the aforesaid act, which releases shall be duly filed in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth.

CHAPTER MMMX.

AN ACT GRANTING AN ANNUITY FOR THE USE OF JOHN MALONEY.

Whereas John Maloney of the borough of Lancaster, served as a soldier in the American army during the revolutionary war with Great Britain, from June one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five, until January one thousand seven hundred and eighty-one, and at the battle of Brandywine was wounded in the public service by which, together with other injuries and hardships incident to military service, he has become incapable of bodily labor, and hath applied to his country for relief: Therefore,
