CHAPTER MMMXVI.

AN ACT SUPPLEMENTARY TO AN ACT, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO PRO-VIDE FOR THE SETTLEMENT OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES THEREIN MENTIONED." (1).

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, the members of both houses of the general assembly, shall convene in the chamber of the house of representatives, at the hour of twelve o'clock at noon, for the purpose of choosing a state treasurer, upon which occasion the speaker of the house of representatives shall preside as chairman, any law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER MMMXVII.

AN ACT TO ENABLE THE ADMINISTRATORS OF HENRY LENNOX SHEP-PERD, LATE OF THE COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND, DECEASED, TO CONVEY CERTAIN LOTS OF GROUNDS TO THE PURCHASERS THERE-OF.

Whereas it appears that Henry Lennox Shepperd, late of the county of Westmoreland, deceased, was owner and proprietor of a tract of land containing fifty acres and one half, situate in South Huntingdon township and county aforesaid, adjoining lands of Ezekiel Sample, Esq. Nathan Smith, Philip Reagen and others, did in his lifetime sell and engaged to convey to sundry persons, several lots of ground of the tract aforesaid, of which sale or engagement there are no written evidences, sufficient to enable the administrators of the said deceased to fulfil the same, and to make and execute deeds to the purchasers of the said lots of ground, consistent with the existing laws of this commonwealth: Therefore,
