Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into by the said John and Margaret M'Clellen, be, and the same is hereby declared to be null and void, and the parties respectively set free and discharged from the marriage contract, and all the duties arising under the same as fully and absolutely as if they had never been joined in marriage; but nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect or render illegitimate, any child or children born of the body of the said Margaret during the coverture.

## CHAPTER MMMXXII.

AN ACT FURTHER EXTENDING THE ACT, ENTITLED "AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF DIVERS INHABITANTS OF THE COUNTY OF ADAMS." (1).

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the provisions of the act, entitled "An act for the relief of divers inhabitants of the county of Adams," passed the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and two, in be, and the same is hereby extended, and to continue in force until the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ten.
