

CHAPTER MMMLXCIV.

AN ACT TO REPEAL AN ACT, ENTITLED "AN ACT ESTABLISHING AN AUCTION STORE IN THE BOROUGH OF LANCASTER." (1).

Whereas a number of the inhabitants of the borough and county of Lancaster, have represented that the law passed the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eight,⁽¹⁾ establishing an auction store in said borough, does not answer the end for which it was intended, but is inconvenient, unnecessary and burdensome, and have prayed that the same may be repealed: Therefore,

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the law passed the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eight,⁽¹⁾ establishing an auction store in the borough of Lancaster be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER MMMLXCV.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING WILLIAM LANE AND THOMAS DAVIS, TO BUILD A BRIDGE ACROSS THE RAYSTOWN BRANCH OF JUNIATA, NEAR THE MOUTH OF YELLOW CREEK.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for William Lane and Thomas Davis, their heirs and assigns, to erect and build, maintain, and support a good and substantial bridge over and across Juniata, at or near the mouth of
