CHAPTER MMMCXXVIII.

AN ACT TO ALTER AND AMEND AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT DIRECTING THE MODE OF SELLING UNSEATED LAND FOR TAXES." (*).

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of September next, the several powers vested in and duties enjoined on the respective sheriffs, by the act to which this is a supplement, shall be transferred to and performed by the county treasurers respectively, under the same obligations and restrictions to which the said sheriffs are by law subjected, and the sales to be by them made in consequence of the transfer aforesaid, shall be as valid in law as sales made by the sheriffs aforesaid, and so much of any law as is hereby altered or supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section II. (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the fees to be received by the respective county treasurers for the services aforesaid, other than the expense of advertising, shall be as follows: to wit,

For selling every tract of land or part thereof, as the case may require, twenty-five cents.

For writing and signing every deed, one dollar and fifty cents.

For acknowledging every deed, twenty-five cents.

For writing and filing every bond to secure the purchase money, twenty-five cents.
