ceiving said licenses, shall deliver them to the persons recommended, on their application and payment therefor, and report quarterly to the judges of the court the names of the persons who have been delinquent in taking out such licenses, whereupon the judges shall direct indictments to be preferred before the grand jury against the said delinquents, for keeping tippling-houses, if it appears by the report of the constables, or other sufficient testimony, they continue to sell spirituous liquors by small measure.

[Section III.] (Section III, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the county treasurers shall receive five per cent., for their services in collecting and paying said license money, and shall settle their accounts in the same manner as for state taxes.

[Section IV.] (Section IV, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the clerks of the several courts of quarter sessions shall receive forty cents, and no more, [from any person,] for reading a petition or application for license, and seventy-five cents, and no more, for issuing every recommendation for the same, which shall be in full for all fees to the said clerks or courts, respectively, for their services.

[Section V.] (Section V, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of every act or acts of this commonwealth, as are supplied by or are contrary to the provisions in this act contained, shall be, and they are hereby repealed and made null and void.

CHAPTER MDCCLXIV.

AN ACT FOR GRANTING A FURTHER SUM OF MONEY FOR OPENING AND IMPROVING THE ROAD FROM WILKES-BARRE TO WYALUSING.

Whereas, by an act of assembly, passed the eleventh day of April, in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, entitled "An act to appropriate certain sums of money, for the

laying out, opening and improving sundry roads within this commonwealth, and for the purposes therein mentioned;" the sum of seven hundred dollars was appropriated for opening and improving the road from Wilkes-Barre to Wyalusing Creek, and it having been represented to the legislature that the said sum of seven hundred dollars is insufficient for that purpose, and the opening and completing the said road being necessary and of public utility. Therefore:

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That a further sum of six hundred dollars, over and above the said sum of seven hundred dollars, shall be, and the same is hereby, granted and appropriated for the purpose of completing the said road from Wilkesbarre to Wyalusing creek, to be paid out of the fund appropriated for the support of government, on a warrant or warrants of the governor for that purpose drawn on the state treasurer.

CHAPTER MDCCLXV.

A SUPPLEMENT TO THE ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A BOARD OF WARDENS FOR THE PORT OF PHILADELPHIA, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES THEREIN MENTIONED."2

In order more effectually to regulate the port of Philadelphia: [Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor shall appoint and commission a person, of good character and competent skill, to be harbor master of the port of Philadelphia; and the said harbor master, having first taken an oath or affirmation, and given bond, with two sufficient sureties, to be approved by the gover-
