CHAPTER MDCCCII.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR DISCHARGING CERTAIN CERTIFICATES OF THIS STATE.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That a sum not exceeding thirty-five thousand dollars, out of the aggregate funds of this state, be, and the same is hereby, appropriated for the payment and discharge of such certificates, granted by virtue of the second section of the act entitled "An act to provide for the settlement of the public accounts, and for other purposes therein mentioned,"¹ passed on the fourth day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, as have been issued, and are not discharged at the time of passing this act.

[Section II.] (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the comptroller and register general shall have the like power to settle and adjust the interest due upon the said certificates, and under the same checks and limitations, as they have in the settlement of other accounts. Provided however, That no interest shall be allowed upon the said certificates from and after the passing of this act, and the governor may and shall draw a warrant or warrants in favor of the parties concerned, in the same manner as in other cases, which warrant or warrants shall be paid by the state treasurer, out of the moneys appropriated by the first section of this act.
