

purposes therein mentioned,"<sup>2</sup> and it shall and may be lawful for the governor, upon receiving a certification as aforesaid of the balance justly due to the said commissioners as aforesaid, to draw his warrant in their favor on the state treasurer for the amount of such balance, who shall thereupon pay the same out of the fund appropriated to the support of government.

(Section II, P. L.) And whereas, owing to the insufficiency of the sum appropriated in the aforesaid act, as well as by reason of the late calamity in the city of Philadelphia, the said commissioners have not fully carried into effect the provisions in the said act contained, directing them to prepare a gallery calculated for the reception of the citizens to hear the debates in the senate of the United States:

Therefore:

[Section II.] Be it enacted by the authority aforesaid, That a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby, granted to the commissioners aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting a convenient gallery in the chamber of the senate of the United States, which sum shall be paid on warrants drawn by the governor, in favor of the said commissioners, on the state treasurer, out of the fund appropriated to the support of government; and a full account of the expenditure thereof shall be laid before the governor by the said commissioners, within nine months from and after the passing of this act.

## CHAPTER MDCCCXXXI.

---

### AN ACT TO ERECT A NEW ELECTION DISTRICT IN THE COUNTY OF ALLEGHENY.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by

the authority of the same, That the following bounds, in the county aforesaid, include and be erected into a separate election district, viz: Beginning at the mouth of Miller's run; thence by a straight line to a point where the Big Lick run empties itself into Montour's run, to James Baggs' fork of the same; thence up said fork to the county line; thence with the county line to Chartier's creek; thence down the same to the place of beginning; and that the freemen residing within the said district are hereby authorized to hold their annual elections at the house now occupied by Henry Noble, in Noblesburgh, under the same regulations prescribed by the constitution and laws of this commonwealth, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

## CHAPTER MDCCCXXXII.

---

AN ACT TO REPEAL SO MUCH OF AN ACT, ENTITLED, "AN ACT FOR RAISING AND COLLECTING OF MONEY ON THE SPECIFIED ARTICLES THEREIN MENTIONED FOR THE SUPPORT OF GOVERNMENT, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES THEREIN MENTIONED"<sup>1</sup> AS IMPOSES A TAX ON THE OWNERS OR POSSESSORS OF ANY COACH, CHARIOT, OR POST CHAISE, PHAETON OR FOUR WHEEL CHAISE, STAGE COACH AND STAGE WAGON.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this act, so much of the act entitled, "An act for raising and collecting of money on the specified articles therein mentioned for the support of government, and for other purposes therein mentioned,"<sup>1</sup> passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three, as directs the raising, levying and collecting the taxes in the said recited act specified, from the
