the authority of the same, That the following bounds, in the county aforesaid, include and be erected into a separate election district, viz: Beginning at the mouth of Miller's run; thence by a straight line to a point where the Big Lick run empties itself into Montour's run, to James Baggs' fork of the same; thence up said fork to the county line; thence with the county line to Chartier's creek; thence down the same to the place of beginning; and that the freemen residing within the said district are hereby authorized to hold their annual elections at the house now occupied by Henry Noble, in Noblesburgh, under the same regulations prescribed by the constitution and laws of this commonwealth, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER MDCCCXXXII.

AN ACT TO REPEAL SO MUCH OF AN ACT, ENTITLED, "AN ACT FOR RAISING AND COLLECTING OF MONEY ON THE SPECIFIED ARTICLES THEREIN MENTIONED FOR THE SUPPORT OF GOVERNMENT, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES THEREIN MENTIONED" AS IMPOSES A TAX ON THE OWNERS OR POSSESSORS OF ANY COACH, CHARIOT, OR POST CHAISE, PHAETON OR FOUR WHEEL CHAISE, STAGE COACH AND STAGE WAGON.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this act, so much of the act entitled, "An act for raising and collecting of money on the specified articles therein mentioned for the support of government, and for other purposes therein mentioned," passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three, as directs the raising, levying and collecting the taxes in the said recited act specified, from the

owners or possessors of any coach, chariot or post chaise, phaeton or four wheel chaise, stage coach and stage wagon, be, and the same is, hereby repealed and made void, anything in the said recited act to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER MDCCCXXXIII.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIRECTORS OF THE LIBRARY COMPANY OF PHILADELPHIA TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL PAYMENT OF THE MEMBERS OF THE SAID COMPANY.

Whereas, by the charter of the said company, the annual payments directed to be made by its respective members appear limited to the sum of ten shillings, which, from the depreciation of money since the year one thousand seven hundred and forty-two, when the said charter was granted, has become inadequate to the purposes originally intended:

And whereas the stockholders in the said company, at a general meeting on the sixteenth of March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, instructed the directors to petition the legislature to pass a law, authorizing the said directors to increase the said payments to two dollars, and it appears reasonable that the prayer of the said petitioners should be granted:

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Therefore be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the directors of the library company, for the time being, be, and they are hereby, authorized to increase the annual payments hereafter to be made by the members of the said company to the sum of two dollars from each member of the said company, anything in the charter thereof to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.
