CHAPTER MDCCCXXXVII.

AN ACT TO ERECT THE TOWNSHIPS OF COCALICO AND ELIZABETH, IN THE COUNTY OF LANCASTER, INTO A SEPARATE ELECTION DISTRICT.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Penusylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the townships of Cocalico and Elizabeth, in the county of Lancaster, are hereby erected into a separate election district, to be called the fifth election district; and the freemen thereof are hereby authorized to hold their annual elections at the house now occupied by Henry Miller, near Ephrata.

CHAPTER MDCCCXXXVIII.

AN ACT TO CEDE TO AND VEST IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA THE ISLAND COMMONLY CALLED MUD ISLAND.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the right, title, property and interest of this commonwealth, in and to the island, commonly called Mud island, situate in the river Delaware, together with all the improvements thereon erected, placed or being, shall be, and hereby are, ceded to and vested in the United States of America, as fully, absolutely, and to the same extent, as this commonwealth now holds and is entitled to and in the same.
