

CHAPTER MDCCCXL.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR EDUCATING JOHN METOXEN, ONE OF THE STOCKBRIDGE TRIBE OF ONEIDA INDIANS.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That upon the application for that purpose of John Metoxen, of the Stockbridge tribe of Oneida Indians, to the governor of this commonwealth, it shall and may be lawful for him to provide for the said Indian, at the public expense, suitable lodging, clothing and entertainment, for a term not exceeding two years, and also to place him at such school or schools, during the said term, as to the governor shall seem proper.

[Section II.] (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars, out of the aggregate funds of this state, be, and the same is hereby, appropriated for the discharge of the expenses which may be incurred under this act.

[Section III.] (Section III, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the governor to draw a warrant or warrants on the state treasurer, for the sum by this act appropriated.
