

And provided further, That the claimants, who are by this act intended to be compensated, shall, at the time of receiving the certificates aforesaid, release to the commonwealth their respective claims to the lands for which they shall receive compensation.

CHAPTER MDCCCLXXVIII.

AN ACT TO EMPOWER THE COMMISSIONERS OF HUNTINGDON COUNTY TO ASSESS AND LEVY THE FURTHER SUM OF SIX HUNDRED POUNDS FOR ERECTING AND COMPLETING THE SAID PUBLIC BUILDINGS IN THE SAID COUNTY.

Whereas the trustees of Huntingdon county have represented to the legislature of this commonwealth that the further sum of six hundred pounds will be necessary for completing the public buildings in the aforesaid county.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it therefore enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of Huntingdon county, of a majority of them, are hereby empowered and required to assess and levy the further sum of six hundred pounds, together with such extra sum as may attend the laying, collecting and paying of the same, in and out of the treasury, upon the said county of Huntingdon, agreeably to the provisions of an act passed the seventeenth day of April last, entitled "An act to regulate the mode of assessing and collecting county rates and levies," which said sum of six hundred pounds shall be placed in the treasury of the county, subject to the drafts of the said trustees for erecting and completing the public buildings in the county aforesaid.
